

Executive Order No. 3-86

WHEREAS, on March 6, 1986, the Philadelphia Special Investigation Commission issued a report on its Findings, Conclusions and Recommendations in connection with the events leading up to and including the incident of May 13, 1985, in the neighborhood of 6221 Osage Avenue, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania ("Report");

WHEREAS, the Report contained thirty-eight separate recommendations relating to:

- a) Operation of City Government,
- b) Operation of the Police Department,
- c) Police and Fire Department Coordination,
- d) Local Government Responses to Crisis Situations,
- e) Laws and Regulations, and
- f) Disciplinary Action and Further Investigation; and

WHEREAS, there are outstanding matters relating to the Report and the May 13 incident which involve operational, legal and policy considerations for the government of the City of Philadelphia ("City");

NOW THEREFORE, by the power vested in me in accordance with Sections 1-102 and 4-100 of the Philadelphia Home Rule Charter, it is hereby ordered as follows:.,

1. An oversight group, to be known as the Executive Management Group ("Group"), is hereby created for the following purposes:

- a) To review the recommendations in the Report and to deliver to the Mayor a written response to each recommendation in as expeditious and diligent a manner as possible.
- b) To oversee the implementation of any such recommendations; and
- c) To coordinate all responses of the City to all MOVE-related matters.

2. The Group shall meet regularly and shall report directly to the Mayor.

3. The members of the Group shall be as follows:

- a) John E. Flaherty, Jr., Deputy Mayor
- b) James S. White, Managing Director
- c) Handsel B. Minyard, City Solicitor

4. Deputy Mayor Flaherty shall serve as Chairman of the Group.

5. This Order shall be effective March 10, 1986.
