

Top Social Media Report

This month, a few of our top posts on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram were job opportunities, Mummers Parade updates, funding announcements and the Festival of Lights event. In addition to these larger announcements, our followers were interested in the Christmas tree recycling program, our 2016 year in review, our guide to winter fun, MLK volunteer opportunities, and the Community Propagation Program at the Horticulture Center. Below is an overview of our top social media posts in the last month.

Facebook followers were excited to learn about the \$1 million in federal funding that has been granted to the Kensington & Tacony Trail by Governor Tom Wolf and PennDOT! The first phase of the K&T Trail, which is expected to open this year, will travel through Lardner's Point Park. Once all phases are complete, the trail will connect Frankford Boat Launch and Tacony Boat Launch. This post reached over 8,000 people and gained 216 reactions (comments, likes, shares). The announcement had 419 post clicks, which linked to the <u>full list of</u> PennDOT projects that are in line to receive \$33 million in federal funds to improve transportation alternatives.



We are excited to announce that \$1 million in federal funding has been granted to the Kensington & Tacony Trail by Governor Tom Wolf and the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT)! This contribution will assist in the second phase of the K&T trail project, with the first phase expected to open later this year.

PPR and our partner Delaware River City Corporation are repurposing the abandoned freight rail line along the Delaware River to a 1.5-mile trail that features new landscaping, rest areas and informational signage that will describe natural features and the historical heritage of this portion of the waterfront.


Governor Wolf Announces 51 PennDOT Projects Statewide
