DIVISION OF COMMUNITY-BASED PREVENTION SERVICES (CBPS)

The Department of Human Services (DHS) is entrusted with protecting our city's children from abuse, neglect and delinquency. We are committed to ensuring the safety and well-being of children and protecting them from imminent danger. As part of that mission, the **Division of Community Based Prevention Services (CBPS)** was founded in 2000 to ensure that at-risk children receive the social and structural supports that will strengthen their families and allow them to thrive. In addition, the Division aims to achieve permanency and stability for children within the system and prevent their re-entry into child protection services.

At CBPS, our services strive to address the underlying problems that lead to abuse, neglect and delinquency and to support, first and foremost, the children/youth and families reported for safety concerns as well as at-risk children before their situation leads to more intensive involvement in the DHS system.

Prevention services are provided in collaboration with a host of community partners, including the School District of Philadelphia and Philadelphia Family Court. Services are offered through a network of approximately 300 community-based private provider agencies.

Internal Referral and Support Services (IRSS): Gateway for All Referrals

IRSS is the gateway to all voluntary services and is the central point of contact for CBPS information and referrals. To get information and referral assistance for most of the programs in this directory call IRSS staff, where social workers will assess a family's needs and link them to the most appropriate services. **To contact IRSS, call 215-683-4000.**

Abuse and Neglect Hotline

Achieving Independence Center (AIC)

This is a one-stop center for youth ages 16-21 in out-of-home placement preparing to leave the dependency system. The Center provides older youth an opportunity to develop independent living skills, build a network of social supports, assist with educational goals and find safe, affordable housing and stable employment. **To contact AIC, call 215-574-9194.**

GENERAL PREVENTION AND SUPPORT SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE DIVISION OF COMMUNITY-BASED PREVENTION SERVICES (CBPS)

Diversion Case Management

Diversion case management services are offered to families who have been referred to DHS where no active safety issues exist, and families in at-risk categories for child abuse, neglect, and/or delinquency. These services are designed to address the identified concerns and thereby prevent a subsequent or initial report to the Department. Diversion programs use a professional social worker to establish helping relationships, assess complex problems, select problem-solving interventions, and help families function effectively. The social worker also arranges, coordinates, monitors, evaluates, and advocates for a package of multiple services to meet the family's specific needs. *To make a referral, contact IRSS at 215-683-4000.*

Parenting Education and Support

The Parenting Collaborative consists of approximately 60 community based agencies offering about 200 parenting groups throughout Philadelphia. Most classes are open to all parents but some are targeted to special populations (e.g. teen parents, parents with mental health/substance use issues, fathers/male caregivers, grandparents). Programs aim to help families understand abuse and neglect, child development, alternatives to corporal punishment, how to effectively manage anger, and how to access community resources. Parent educators are trained on the latest research and best practices to support parents and caregivers. *To make a referral, contact IRSS at 215-683-4000.*

The Parent Action Network (PAN) primarily serves parents whose children are in out-of-home care and who are working towards reunification with children. PAN is committed to helping children achieve permanency and stability and offers groups specifically designed to prepare biological parents of children in DHS custody for reunification. There are also general parenting groups for caregivers who are incarcerated, adopted parents, and legal custodians. Information and referral services as well as on-site child care and travel reimbursement for meetings are also available. *To make a referral, call 215-PARENTS.*

Youth Development Programs

Youth development programs provide a wide array of cultural, athletic, life skills, community services, and other socialization and recreational programs for children and youth. *To make a referral, contact IRSS at 215-683-4000.*

After-School and Enrichment Programs

There are a variety of after-school and summer activities that take place on school and community-based sites throughout Philadelphia. These age-appropriate programs help school-age children/youth and out-of-school youth build their emotional, social, and academic skills and can include learning activities, homework assistance, employment or skills training, and structured cultural and sports activities. *For help locating an after-school or enrichment program, contact IRSS at 215-683-4000. Delinquency and Violence Prevention

Delinquency and violence prevention programs seek to address the service needs of chronically truant youth, first-time offending youth with minor charges, and other youth identified by DHS to be at highest risk for delinquency. Delinquency prevention programs offer a mix of services aimed to address interpersonal and social skills, behavior modification, family intervention, and

educational support. Core components of all programs include academic assistance, counseling, community service, physical and behavioral health supports, life skills, and job readiness/employment training. Most delinquency prevention providers also provide cultural enrichment activities, law-related education, victim and community awareness education, and physical activities. *To make a referral, contact IRSS at 215-683-4000.*

Families whose children are exhibiting behaviors that are currently out of the parent's control or are placing the child at risk, e.g. delinquency, drug/alcohol abuse, runaway, curfew problems, are referred to the Prevention Services Unit (formally REAAP) for more intensive intervention services. *To make a referral, contact the Family Court Prevention Service Unit at 215-686-8328.*

SPECIALIZED SUPPORT SERVICES

Truancy Intervention Services

Through the Regional Truancy Courts program, DHS works in collaboration with the School District of Philadelphia (SDP), Family Court, and other partners to improve school attendance and reduce truancy through multiple strategies. Currently eight Regional Truancy Courts operate in eight regions of the city to hear cases involving truancy of youth in 4th -10th grades. Approximately 20 community-based agencies provide family support/case management for these families, to resolve the underlying issues contributing to the truant behavior. Services are provided for 60 days and include comprehensive assessments, a family development plan, home visits, strength-based case management (including referral and linkage to appropriate services) and follow-up. *Enrollment is limited to families with youth listed as truant by the School District of Philadelphia.*

Truant children in grades K-3 are referred directly to CBPS and connected to Diversion Case Management or other appropriate services. *Families with children in grades K-3 experiencing school attendance issues can access services through IRSS at 215-683-4000.*

Enhanced Services for Children of Women in Substance Abuse Treatment

The Enhanced Services program provides services to women in residential and outpatient substance abuse treatment programs who are pregnant or have children under five years old. To receive this service, women must be enrolled in treatment at one of the several designated treatment centers designed to reduce the incidence of abuse and neglect among women with dependency issues. Women are linked to a Family Services Coordinator who develops a plan for her and her children at the same time her chemical dependency is being addressed. The program also provides an aftercare advocate who provides intensive ongoing services to help the client sustain recovery. *To make a referral, contact IRSS at 215-683-4000.*

Domestic Violence Services (*Domestic Violence Hotline: 1-866-SAFE-014*)

Domestic violence services are available to families and youth who have been involved in or exposed to domestic violence and are either involved with DHS or at risk of DHS involvement.

Services include counseling, education, training workshops, resource linkages, and aftercare services. *To make a referral, contact IRSS at 215-683-4000.*

Programs operated by several community-based providers, including: Congreso de Latinos Unidos, Lutheran Children and Family Services, Women Against Abuse and Women in Transition.

Treatment and re-education program for men and women who are abusive in their relationships. The target population includes families seeking reunification, as well as others involved with DHS or at risk for DHS involvement. There is a Spanish-language men's group available in North Philadelphia.

Re-engagement Center

Located in the main offices of the School District of Philadelphia at 440 North Broad Street, the Re-Engagement Center was established to provide alternative educational pathways for students between ages 16-21 who have disengaged or dropped out from a traditional school setting. These pathways are designed to assist students in earning their high school diploma or its equivalent. *To make an appointment with the Re-Engagement Center, contact 215-400-6700.*

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Equal Partners in Change (EPIC) Stakeholder Groups

EPIC Stakeholder Groups consist of individuals who live and/or work in a community and are actively involved in the continued development of the community. There are ten stakeholder groups located throughout Philadelphia that meet monthly and, using a process called EPIC and facilitated by truancy prevention provider agencies, develop and implement action plans that complement and enhance the community's assets. The overriding goal of EPIC groups is to improve the quality of life and reduce barriers to success, recognizing that many challenges that lead to truancy, delinquency, and violence may be addressed via community involvement that increases the quality of living for children and families. *To find out about an EPIC group in your community, call IRSS at 215-683-4000.*

- hold workshops for parents
- conduct home visits
- monitor attendance and attends truancy court if necessary
- emphasize college access
- uses a multi-faceted approach to help parents

Student Advisors have the following responsibilities in public schools:

- provide support to students
- are responsible for a core group of students
- place an emphasis on at-risk students (facilitates them; peer counseling, etc.)
- conduct pull-outs for students who need targeted attention
