**The following are the titles of
Bills introduced in City Council
on March 3, 2005**

Bill No. 050187: “An Ordinance amending Title 17 of The Philadelphia Code, entitled ‘Contracts and Procurement,’ by providing that if any existing or new City contract grants the City the right to use or control the use of a suite, box, or other portion of a sports stadium, ballpark, arena or other sports facility (‘City suite’), such City suite must be leased by the City to the highest responsible bidder, with all rental payments under such lease paid over to certain organizations, all under certain terms and conditions.”

Bill No. 050188: “An Ordinance amending Title 19 of The Philadelphia Code, entitled ‘Finance, Taxes and Collections,’ by creating a Rainy Day Fund to cushion the impact of unanticipated declines in City revenues; providing for the circumstances under which City monies must be deposited into the Rainy Day Fund and the circumstances under which expenditures may be made from the Rainy Day Fund;

and providing for the custody and management of the Rainy Day Fund; all under certain terms and conditions.”

Bill No. 050189: “An Ordinance amending Bill No. 040369, which became law June 21, 2004, entitled ‘An Ordinance amending Chapter 14-1600 of The Philadelphia Code, entitled ‘Miscellaneous,’ by adding a new section prohibiting the demolition of buildings or other structures located within the area bounded on the north by the south side of Locust Street, on the west by the east side of Fifth Street, on the south by the north side of Washington Street, and on the east by the Delaware River, and providing that such prohibition shall expire after a specified period of time, all under certain terms and conditions,’ by extending the expiration date of the ordinance.”

Bill No. 050190: “An Ordinance dissolving the Networks Tax Increment Financing District, being the area generally bounded by Sixteenth Street on the west, Spring Garden Street on the north, Hamilton Street on the south, and Fifteenth Street on the east, in accordance with the Tax Increment Financing Act, being the Act of July 11, 1990, P.L. 465, No. 113, as amended.”

Bill No. 050191: “An Ordinance granting permission to Moore College, owner of the property 1915 Race Street, Philadelphia, PA 19103, to operate and maintain an open air sidewalk café on the north sidewalk of Race Street, under certain terms and conditions.”
