
## EXECUTIVE ORDER 1-65

As of this date, pursuant to and by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 3-100(h) of the Philadelphia Home Rule Charter, I do hereby create and establish the Philadelphia Anti-Poverty Action Committee, which committee will establish policies necessary to guide the City's Anti-Poverty Campaign under the Economic Opportunity Act, and which committee will exercise supervision over the total program.

The committee shall consist of thirty-one (31) members and shall include five citizens appointed directly by the Mayor; the President of City Council; the President Judge of the County Court of the City and County of Philadelphia; and representatives from the following designated community organizations:

- AFL-CIO (Philadelphia Council)
- Chamber of Commerce
- Congress of Racial Equality (Philadelphia Branch)
- Delaware Valley Settlement Alliance
- Federation of Jewish Agencies
- Greater Philadelphia Movement
- Health and Welfare Council
- National Association for the Advancement  
of Colored People (Philadelphia Branch)
- Philadelphia Archdiocese
- Philadelphia Board of Education
- Philadelphia Council of Churches
- Urban League (Philadelphia Chapter)

In addition, the committee shall include one representative from each of the twelve (12) Community Action Councils established in the various poverty areas of the City. Each representative shall be elected from among the twelve (12) Community Action Council members within each poverty area. The members themselves shall be directly elected by the residents of the poverty area which they shall represent.
