- 1) Fold in half the long way, then unfold.
- 2) Fold in half the short way. Fold the ends of the sheet backward to the center crease, then unfold.
- 3) Cut an center dotted line - only where there are dots!
- 4) Arrange page so that all folds along the short dimension of the page are open flat. Re fold in half along the long (partially cut) fold.
- 5) Pinch each end of the folded sheet, with the long crease at the top, and push both ends toward the one another. The center cut will open like a mouth and four pages take shape. Fold this page, and the cover (Me Book's & Be Boin's Guide to the Street Matters) around to the outside of the book to complete the single sheet book.


