The **YES program** is a summer employment and learning opportunity that increases teens' awareness of nature and the ecology of their urban communities and provides them with hands-on stewardship experience in their neighborhood park or recreation center.

Participants will perform restoration and beautification projects under the direct guidance of an environmental instructor. Majority of the work is performed in an outdoor setting: wooded areas, trails, park or recreation center. There is limited classroom-type learning that includes keeping a written log of project progress and preparing with teammates for a final group oral presentation. Participants will also take a few field trips. Candidates must be interested in working outdoors in the heat and getting their hands dirty. A six-week commitment is required.

The YES program is a partnership with the PHS Philadelphia Green program and Fairmount Park.

A. Summer Reading 2009

V. The Department of Human Services

These DHS-funded Out-of-School Time (OST) opportunities combine fun and learning for youth ages 5 – 21 in programs operated by community-based organizations in public schools and community settings. Targeted youth are those already in or are at risk of being in the DHS system of care, but not exclusively.

There is an emphasis on age appropriate programming, literacy and project-based learning. Openings occur throughout the year and many providers maintain waiting lists. In some instances, providers charge a small fee, but it must be waived if the family cannot afford it.

All summer programs begin July 6 and run until August 14, generally Monday – Friday, 9-5. During the school year elementary age, structured programs operate Monday – Friday, 3-6 PM. Days and hours of the Middle and High School programs vary. Each program is different, but core standards are met in all.

Big Picture provides young people ages 10 to 18 with mural training and visual arts education through four sequential sessions beginning in October and running through August.

In the first three sessions—which focus on community and social responsibility—students concentrate on foundational art skills, mural design, and small indoor or outdoor mural-making. During the fourth session students are involved in large-scale mural or mixed-media projects with professional artists. Participants receive a modest stipend during the summer session.

Throughout each of the four sessions, students learn progressively more complex skills, ranging from basic artistic techniques to advanced mural painting. Lessons are designed to help young people become creative and critical thinkers and to better prepare them for the workforce through problem solving and teamwork development.
