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Ms. Weiss called to order the Deferred Compensation Plan Committee Meeting for August 21, 2013

Agenda Item 1 - Approval of Minutes of July 25, 2013

Ms. Weiss requested a motion to approve the Minutes of July 25, 2013. Mr. Rice made the motion and Mr. Albert seconded it. There was no discussion. All were in favor. There were no oppositions or abstentions. The motion passed.

Agenda Item #2 - Deferred Compensation Plan Update/Activity Report - July 2013

Ms. Cherry said the update for the investment side is that staff will present the fund performance for the second quarter next month. The socially responsible fund options will also be presented next month.

Ms. Wilkes reported there were 17,014 participants in June. In July, there were 17,030 participants, an increase of sixteen for the month. The total plan assets for this month saw a record increase which was a little shy of \$28 million in new assets [approximately \$743 million in total plan assets] and seventy-two new enrollments. Part of the increase, slightly more than \$13.2 million, came from seventy drop enrollments. It is the highest number of drop enrollments since ICMA-RC has been with the City of Philadelphia.

Mr. Sharer announced the replacement for Ms. Noel, Mr. Randy McLaurin. He stated Mr. McLaurin is a current ICMA-RC associate; he currently performs the same task in the Colorado area and he comes with a great deal of experience and knowledge.

Mr. McLaurin stated he has been in the industry for twenty years; the last seven years were with ICMA-RC. Mr. McLaurin will be moving from Denver, Colorado to Washington D.C.

At 9:36 a.m. Ms. Weiss requested a motion to adjourn the Deferred Compensation Plan Committee Meeting. Mr. Albert made the motion and Mr. Stagliano seconded it. There was not discussion. All were in favor. There were no oppositions or abstentions. The motion passed.
