Dear Water Customer

April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2013

I am writing to alert you that the Water Department will be continuing construction work in your neighborhood in the near future. The sewer located in the street listed below has outlived its useful lifespan and must be lined in order to safeguard your water and sewer services and prevent potential leaks or breaks from flooding and damaging City streets and private property.

The Water Department has hired a private contractor, **Carusone Contractors, Inc**, to perform "No Dig" Sewer liner installations. They have hired a subcontractor, **Allstate Power Vac**, to perform the specialized lining work. There are several sections of sewer within the above mentioned block that will need to have liners installed in them. The lining work is scheduled to start on or about **Friday, April 18<sup>th</sup>, 2014**. The Manhole Rehabilitation work will be done at a later date, and is schedule to be completed by approximately **June 30<sup>th</sup> of 2014**. In the event of rain, any of the liner installation may have to be postponed. By using this trenchless method of sewer rehabilitation work, this project can be completed in less time without the dust and dirt, and repaving associated with standard trench work. However, you may notice a glue-like odor from the construction process. The Water Department will have an on-site Inspector. Due to the large equipment and hoses on site, it may be necessary to post "No Parking" signs.

The work has 3 phases for the liner that is to be installed: **Phase One:** Cleaning and preparation for lining of the sewer. **Phase Two:** The lining of the sewer and restoration of laterals. **Phase Three:** Replacement of the existing Manhole Frames & Lids, and rehabilitation of the manholes.

**The residents that will be affected will be given a separate notice by the contractor, prior to the Phase Two lining portion of the Sewer to be lined. When you receive those letters, please take notice of the information within them.** The duration of the lining process will be approximately **1 Day**. Due to the nature of the lining process, the sewer will be blocked for approximately **12 hours**, while the liner is installed and lateral service is restored. During this time period, limited use of the toilet or washing of hands would be fine within the length of sewer being lined. However, it is essential that you do not use your washer (the laundry), take long showers, run the dishwasher, or do any cleaning that can be postponed. Your service pipe has a limited capacity to store water

during this time period; therefore, we require that you delay water usage as much as possible.

During normal working hours for the liner installation, between **7:00 AM and completion of the liner installation**, the contractor may post "No-Parking" signs on an as required basis as the work proceeds.

The Water Department has assigned an Inspector to the project that will be on-site every day. Should you experience any problems as a result of the work, please ask to talk with the Inspector on the job site. He will discuss the problem with the contractor and do whatever possible to assist you.

If you are unable to contact the Inspector at the job site, or have any other questions concerning the work, please contact me at the number listed below between 8:30 AM and 5:00 PM, Monday thru Friday. Should an emergency occur during non-working hours, please call the Water Department hot line at 215-685-6300, where someone will take your call at any time.

Please keep these phone numbers handy in the event you find a need for our assistance, and thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation.
