




# How will the rate increase impact water bills?

A typical residential customer would generally see increases shown in the table below:

<b>Monthly bill for a typical residential customer</b>			
Fiscal year	Requested increase of monthly bill	Additional monthly water & sewer charge	Average monthly bill total <sup>1</sup>
Current	none	none	<b>\$67.40</b>
July 1, 2016	6.2%	\$4.20	<b>\$71.60</b>
July 1, 2017	5.5%	\$3.90	<b>\$75.50</b>



**Who is a "typical" residential customer?** Our typical residential customer has a 5/8" water meter and uses 600 cubic feet of water (4,488 gallons) per month. Different water usage will result in higher or lower charges.

## What about senior citizens?

<b>Senior citizen: a sample monthly bill</b>			
Fiscal year	Requested increase of monthly bill	Additional monthly water & sewer charge	Average monthly bill total <sup>1</sup>
Current	none	none	<b>\$50.50</b>
July 1, 2016	6.2%	\$3.10	<b>\$53.60</b>
July 1, 2017	5.5%	\$3.00	<b>\$56.60</b>

**Senior citizens:** We based these amounts on a 5/8" meter and monthly usage of 600 cubic feet.

1. Philadelphia Water's typical residential customer average monthly bill totals have been rounded to the nearest ten cents.
