

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 3-92

VENDOR ADVISORY BOARD

I, EDWARD G. RENDELL, by the power vested in me by the Philadelphia Home Rule Charter, do hereby ORDER:

SECTION 1. Executive Order No. 7-85, establishing the Mayor's Vendor Advisory and Development Board of Philadelphia, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. Establishment of Vendor Advisory Board. There is hereby established in the Department of Licenses and Inspections ("Department") the Vendor Advisory Board ("Board").

SECTION 3. Composition of the Vendor Advisory Board. The Vendor Advisory Board shall consist of nine members: one (1) representative of the business community, one (1) representative of a neighborhood resident organization, two (2) representatives of the vendor community, and three (3) at-large members, all to be appointed by the Mayor; and two (2) at-large members to be appointed by the President of City Council. All members shall serve for terms of one (1) year, and members may be reappointed to any number of additional one (1) year terms.

SECTION 4. Functions. The Board shall:

- a. Advise the Department on all matters concerning the regulation of street vendors and sidewalk sales;
- b. Perform those functions assigned to the Vendor Advisory Board by Section 9-204 of The Philadelphia Code, including developing proposed regulations concerning vending for submission to the Department;
- c. Develop recommendations as to vendor orientation programs and a Vendor Handbook; and
- d. Perform such other advisory duties as the Commissioner of the Department may request.

SECTION 5. Staffing. The Commissioner of the Department of Licenses and Inspections shall provide administrative staff and support services to the Board to enable it to perform its duties.
