PHILADELPHIA WATER DEPARTMENT RESPONSE TO TRANSCRIPT REQUEST

TR-11.PLEASE IDENTIFY ANY PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITIES
COMMISSION DECISIONS APPROVING MULTI-YEAR RATE REQUESTS
FOR THE PAST 10 YEARS.

RESPONSE:

As noted in PWD Rebuttal Statement No. 1, Page 2, Lines 17-19 only state that the Pennsylvania Public Utilities Commission (PA PUC) has seen multi-year <u>requests</u>, but does not state that the PA PUC has <u>approved</u> any multi-year rate requests. It is Black & Veatch's understanding that the PA PUC will hear multi-year requests. This forms the basis of the referenced sentence.

In our response to PA Statement No. 1, PWD Rebuttal Statement No. 1, Questions 4 and 5, state that approval of multi-year rate increases for municipal utilities is a common occurrence. Municipal utilities elect to take this approach for a number of reasons including cost effectiveness of the rate approval process, revenue certainty, and certainty for capital improvement program execution and resource planning. For municipal utilities that have obtained a multi-year approval, the approved annual rate increase goes into effect as an administrative procedure without the need for additional public hearings and/or approval. The table on Page 4 of PWD Rebuttal Statement No. 1, presents a representative list of municipal utilities that follow this practice.

Within the regulated utility sector, utilities such as Xcel Energy and National Grid commonly receive multi-year increases in states such as Minnesota, Colorado, and Rhode Island. The PUC in these jurisdictions approve 3 to 4-year rate increases for these utilities. For regulated

water utilities, the Rhode Island PUC routinely approves multi-year 3-step rate increases for Pawtucket Water Supply Board, Kent County Water Authority, Narragansett Bay Commission, and Newport Water. The Rhode Island PUC approves the increases on an annual basis based on a compliance filing.
