What is Rebuild?


Rebuild will invest hundreds of millions of dollars to fix neighborhood parks, recreation centers and libraries across Philadelphia.

Who will hire businesses & contractors for Rebuild projects?

Most projects will be managed by qualified nonprofit organizations. These organizations will hire all contractors, design firms, and other businesses for projects they manage.

Other projects will be managed by the City of Philadelphia or the Philadelphia Redevelopment Authority.

How to Work on Rebuild Projects



- Get email updates about new contract opportunities by signing up for Rebuild's email list at Rebuild.Phila.Gov and selecting "Vendor Updates."
- Share information about your business with the organizations that will be hiring vendors for projects through Rebuild's Call for Interest at Rebuild.Phila.Gov.
- Search for available contract opportunities at Rebuild.Phila.Gov through Rebuild's Contract Opportunity Portal.
- Make sure you are up to date on your City taxes or in a payment plan. This is a requirement to work on Rebuild projects. Visit Phila.Gov/Revenue to learn more.
- Become certified if you are a minority or woman-owned business. Being certified will help Rebuild meet its diversity goals and could make you more competitive for contract opportunities. Visit phila.mwdsbe.com for information on how to become certified.
