

## Building a Fair Future For All Philadelphians

Philadelphia Beverage Tax Program Updates March 2019



Rebuilding Community Infrastructure (Rebuild) is a once-in-a-generation opportunity to invest hundreds of millions of dollars in physical improvements to Philadelphia's parks, recreation centers, and libraries.

- **64 initial sites** (two-thirds are in high needs neighborhoods)
- **30 projects already launched** or starting by this summer, representing more than **\$100 million** worth of improvements
- More Rebuild sites will be presented to City Council this spring
- Ambitious diversity targets:
  - 25-35% of all dollars from Rebuild contracts expected to go to minority-owned businesses
  - 15-20% of all dollars from Rebuild contracts expected to go to women-owned businesses
  - 45% of total hours worked on Rebuild sites expected to be completed by minorities, and 5% by women
- The **Emerging Vendors Program** helps minority and women-owned businesses to get certified and get Rebuild contracts



PHLpreK offers free, quality pre-K to Philadelphia children ages 3-4. There are no income requirements for families.

- 85 PHLpreK sites citywide
- 4,000+ children served since January 2017
- Growing to serve 5,500 students every year
- 55 providers are women- and/or minority-owned businesses
- 35 providers significantly improved their program's quality rating, and **95% have high-quality ratings** in the state's STARS system
- **99% of parents** would recommend PHLpreK to others
- 278 new PHLpreK jobs created since 2017
- 182 PHLpreK staff are participating in continuing education and professional development this year

**Community Schools** 

## Community Schools are neighborhood public schools that use City resources and partnerships to support students and families.

- Across 12 Community Schools,
  6,500 children (and their families and neighbors) are served
- Five more schools will become Community Schools soon
- The percentage of Community School students with 95% attendance grew from 29% to 42% from year one to year two
- 70% of students live at or below the poverty line
- 100,000+ pounds of free, nutritious food provided to students and community members
- 425+ residents enrolled in adult education classes
- 260+ students connected with career readiness opportunities
