BACKGROUND: WorkReady Philadelphia is a citywide effort to address the skills gap by convening partners, employers, leaders of youth-serving systems and youth to build a coordinated approach to preparing young people for future employment. The summer jobs program is funded by the City of Philadelphia, Philadelphia Works, businesses and philanthropy, and it is managed by the Philadelphia Youth Network. WorkReady stakeholders seek to give young people ages 12-24 access to a meaningful paid work experience that connects youth to caring adults and offers the opportunity to build the transferable skills required to secure and sustain employment. The City of Philadelphia Department of Human Services is the largest city funder of summer jobs on behalf of WorkReady.
