#### **DIRECTIONS**

<u>Driving</u>: Parking locally is \$7 (early bird) to \$30. Parking is available in the garage next to the Reading Terminal Market with entrances on 11th and Arch Street. There is another garage on 10th Street between Filbert and Arch Streets.

<u>Train</u>: Stop is the Jefferson Station. Take the 12<sup>th</sup> Street steps to 12th Street. Bear left to and go through the glass doors and up the escalator.
