

PROPOSED INCREASES IN WATER, SEWER AND STORMWATER RATES AND CHARGES

Notice is hereby given that, on March 6, 2012, the Philadelphia Water Department filed proposed regulations with the Department of Records to increase Water, Sewer, Stormwater, Fire Connection and Miscellaneous Rates and Charges. The proposed regulations are as follows:

- Rates and Charges Definitions (Sections 300.0, et seq.);
- Water Charges (Sections 302.0, et seq.);
- Sewer Charges (Sections 303.0, et seq.);
- Stormwater Management Service Charges (Sections 304.0, et seq.);
- Billing for Water, Sewer and Stormwater (Sections 305.0, et seq.);
- Miscellaneous Water Charges (Sections 306.0, et seq.);
- Miscellaneous Sewer Charges (Sections 307.0, et seg.);

The proposed changes in water, sewer, stormwater and fire connection charges provide for a four-phase rate increase. The first phase is proposed to become effective October 1, 2012. The second, third and fourth phase will be consecutively implemented on July 1 of 2013, 2014 and 2015. The effect of the proposed increase on a typical residential water and sewer customer would be as follows:
