Unemployment Compenstation (UC):

Traditional program for W-2 workers with a significant work history

2 Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC):

> Extra 13 weeks of UC eligibility for people who have exhausted their benefits

3 Pandemic Unemployment **Assistance (PUA):**

> New program for those who don't qualify for UC, such as 1099 & gig workers, people who are self-employed, have limited recent work history, or who have no recent work history but can't start a job due to COVID, etc.

Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (PUC)

> Extra \$600 per week given automatically to people receiving UC and PUA.

through July 31, 2020



Emergency Assistance Program (EAP)

One time cash grant equal to 2 months of TANF grant amount for person living with their child/ pregnant; household member was working on March 11, 2020 and lost 50% of income due to Covid 19.

Ends July 12, 2020 or when \$ runs out

Economic Impact Payments:

Stimulus fund payment from federal government of \$1200 per adult and \$500 per child under 17 in household. Some 17-18 year olds qualify for their own payment.

LIHEAP Recovery Crisis:

Grants of up to \$800 paid directly to utility or fuel vendor for people behind on heating or electric bills or in need of repairs for heaters or other energy equipment.

8 TANF

Ongoing cash grant to support families with children/pregnant people with very little income; work requirements currently not being enforced.

9 TANF Diversion Program

One time cash grant equal to 1-3 months of TANF grant amount for a person living with their child/pregnant with very little income and a recent work history past 180 days (includes training programs).

SNAP:

Ongoing monthly grant for food costs; all households currently receiving max grant amount.

WIC:

Provides pregnant women, parents or caregivers of children under age 5 with healthy foods, nutrition education, and breastfeeding support.

Kids who were getting free lunch at school will get extra \$370 in SNAP. *No application needed.*

MA:

CHIP: Provides health insurance to any child in PA, with free and low cost coverage available to low income families.
