Philadelphia Beverage Tax Program Updates Spring 2020





Rebuild is a once-in-a-generation opportunity to invest hundreds of millions of dollars in improvements to Philadelphia's parks, recreation centers, and libraries.

PHLpreK offers free, quality pre-K to Philadelphia children ages 3-4. There are no income requirements for families.

- 72 initial facilities (two-thirds are in high needs neighborhoods)
- Projects underway at 62 facilities, representing more than \$120 million of improvements
- 27 diverse Philadelphians accepted into Rebuild training or apprenticeships in skilled trades unions
- 82 businesses enrolled in Rebuild small business supports
- On track to meet ambitious diversity targets:
 - 44% of committed contract dollars slated to go to minority-owned businesses
 - 24% of committed contract dollars slated to go to minority-owned businesses
 - 44% of total workforce hours completed by women or minorities

- 138 PHLpreK sites citywide offering 3,300 seats in the 2019-2020 school year
- 6,000+ children served since January 2017
- By 2023, PHLpreK will grow to serve 5,500 students every year
- 39 providers significantly improved their program's quality rating, and 90% have high-quality ratings in the state's STARS system
- 93% of parents would recommend PHLpreK to others
- 350 new PHLpreK jobs created since 2017
- 376 PHLpreK staff participated in continuing education and professional development last year

Community Schools

Community Schools are neighborhood public schools that use City resources and partnerships to support students and families.

- 17 Community Schools serve 9,500 children (and their families and neighbors)
- of the time (or more) in 2017-2018, compared to 2016-2017
- \$2.8 million invested in funding for quality out-of-school time programs across all Community Schools
- 1,400 students can participate in new, quality OST programs at **Community Schools**
- 13% more students attended school 95% 330,000 pounds of free, nutritious food distributed at Community Schools
 - 373 residents have enrolled in adult education classes at Community Schools
