## **REGULAR SESSION**

1. <u>Chair's Report</u> – Ronda Goldfein welcomed everyone to the eleventh (11<sup>th</sup>) remote monthly meeting.

# 2. Presentation - CPOC Legislation

Samantha Williams, Director of Legislation and Policy for Councilman Jones, described the new CPOC Legislation. Highlights include: nine (9) voting commission members; training for commissioners; Executive Director and legal counsel; investigating powers for individual complaints as well as in certain areas in the absence of individual complaints; subpoena power; access to evidence and data; the authority to make both disciplinary and policy recommendations; and, participation in charging and prosecution of PBI hearings. This generated questions from the public, including questions regarding financing of the new entity, how to mandate compliance with the new process, and timing.

- **3**. Executive Director's Report Anthony Erace reported that the Police/Community Mediation Program is moving forward.
- **4.** <u>PAC Presentation</u> Angelica Hendricks discussed PAC's review of PPD Pedestrian Investigations and PAC's recommendations in light of recent case law. Angelica discussed PAC's recommendations for the level of suspicion/cause needed vis a vis mere encounters, stops, frisks, and searches/arrests.
