Repaving scheduled in 2020 will include:

- 1. Milling the roadway
- 2. Repaving with fresh asphalt
- 3. Painting new lane lines

WHY TRAFFIC SAFETY MATTERS ON PASSYUNK AND ESSINGTON AVENUES

Every year, there are **over 10,000** reported crashes in Philadelphia, taking the lives of nearly **100 people**. Passyunk and Essington Avenues have a higher rate for severe traffic crashes than average Philadelphia

streets.



CRASHES ON PASSYUNK AND ESSINGTON AVENUES

On the project corridor between 2014 and 2018, there were **179 reported crashes**.
