Analysis Key Findings

- 1. Businesses have unmet loading needs
- 2. Parking is not serving businesses or residents well
- 3. Traffic impacted by double-parking and median parking
- 4. Traffic can be improved by **optimizing signal timing**
- 5. Lane reductions will cause some **increased travel time during rush hours** (5 10 seconds a block) when combined with signal optimization
- 6. During non-rush hours, lane reductions will not increase travel time
- **7. Washington Avenue is dangerous**, especially for people walking and biking, HIN


Some of the questions we asked

- Where does your business load and unload?
- Where do you receive your packages?
- Do your deliveries often park in the median of the street?
- Do your deliveries often double-park in the active traffic lane?
- How often do you take deliveries?
- What times of day and days do you take on-street deliveries?
- How long does a standard delivery take?
- What types of vehicles typically load and unload at your business?
- How much flexibility is there in type of vehicle that loads or unloads?
- Does your business get deliveries or pickups from a postal service (e.g. UPS or FedEx)?
- For the space directly in front of your business, what would be your ideal solution?
- Would you be willing to move your business loading to have more convenient parking for your customers?
- Do your customers need special pick-up zones instead of regular parking?


How long does a typical delivery take?



89% of deliveries to respondents take under 1 hour to complete.




How often do you receive deliveries?



50% of respondents load or unload deliveries at least 3 times a week.




How often do you receive deliveries?

Do your deliveries double park?




64% of respondents stated that their deliveries doublepark.

Do your deliveries park in the median?




28% of respondents stated that their deliveries park in the median.

Note: 48% of respondents declined to answer this question, which could mean the "yes" column is under-reported.




What times of day do you typically load/unload?






What times of day do you typically load/unload?

What times of day do you typically load/unload?




91% of respondents state that they receive deliveries between 5am and 12pm.



Business Preferences for Future Changes: Broad to Columbus


How good a loading solution is a loading zone?



Businesses were extremely positive about dedicated loading zones in this question, with 64% saying the solution was good or very good, and only 12% saying it was bad or very bad.



What is your preference for out front?



42% of businesses said they would prefer free untimed parking in front of their business (what exists today) even though many believe a dedicated loading zone is a good long-term solution to loading needs.



Why this discrepancy?

In person, the business survey respondents often identified the tension between their own desire to be able to park for free all day and the need to prevent others from doing so. Some businesses cited people who work in Center City parking their car on Washington Avenue for the day, to ride their bike or take the subway in to work.

The average duration for vehicles double parking, median parking, or parking in restricted spaces was almost always under an hour, and often as short as 15 minutes or less.

Why turnover is important:

- Business customers cannot find parking, which means they might doublepark, park in the median, or simply choose not to shop along Washington Avenue.
- Businesses cannot load or unload at the curb, which means trucks and other large vehicles might double-park or park in the median. This causes traffic flow issues and sight line issues.
- Near-neighbors cannot use parking on Washington Avenue in the evening as overflow when cars never move from their spaces. This can create parking pressure in neighborhoods around Washington Avenue.




The Goal:


Balance the needs and desires of individual businesses with overall corridor functionality to make parking and loading operations work for everyone on Washington Avenue.



500 Block Proposed - Rationale

The following responded to the survey:

Kevin's Hair Salon
Dentists on Washington
Bro. Nail and Paper Supply

Young Hearts explicitly requested loading out front during the morning and afternoon hours for daycare pick-up and drop-off. Tu's Tea also expressed a preference for loading out front. Observed loading behavior outside Skyline indicates that a loading zone is needed there as well. The rest of the businesses expressed their preference for free all-day parking. We propose free time-limited parking to encourage appropriate turnover.

600 Block Proposed - Rationale

Khmer-Angkor Jewelry stated they only get deliveries via USPS or FedEx and did not specify what they want on the block because they have the plaza parking lot.

Ba Le Bakery does all of their loading in the plaza parking lot.

New World Vision Center gets deliveries from a large truck on Washington as well as smaller trucks in the plaza's parking lot.

Cellular 2000 only gets deliveries from UPS and FedEx, prefers free parking in front of their storefront.


Cellular Inc. gets FedEx and UPS deliveries and would prefer a loading zone in front of their business.








700 Block Existing & Proposed





700 Block Proposed - Rationale


Steel Doors gets deliveries from FedEx and USPS at least once a day. They prefer free parking on the block.

Sunshine Jewelry gets deliveries from USPS. They think a loading zone would work well on their block.

Satellite Auto Glass does all loading on Passyunk Avenue. They prefer free parking for customers on Washington Avenue.


CK Auto Image loads in the median. They would be willing to load up to half a block away to get free customer parking out front.



800 Block Existing & Proposed






Giordano Produce does all their loading on the street. Their comment was, "Parking works at present, leave us alone. PPA enforcement is really annoying and scares away customers."

Anastasi Seafood does all of their loading off-street in the lot next door, but customers doublepark. They prefer on-street parking. (Note: Anastasi Seafood is closing due to a planned development on this corner). Patient Care Center gets deliveries at least once a week. A loading zone would be nice in the morning and evening, but they want free customer parking throughout the day.

Tibet

Businesses on the 900 Block of Washington have mixed loading needs. The Italian Market's loading needs necessitate loading zones at the corner of 9th street, but existing parking lots on the North and South sides of the block allow off-street parking for the other businesses.

7 of the 9 businesses stated they prefer free on-street parking for customers on Washington Avenue.


7-Eleven

Almost every business on this block has off-street parking for customers. The presence of large driveways for this off-street parking means that onstreet parking is limited. A loading zone is proposed for the south side of the block to accommodate Anvil Iron Works. Untimed loading is preserved for the north side of the street to provide longer-term parking to the residents of the Lofts at Bella Vista, which lost street parking after the 11th Street protected bike lane project.


Nam Phong, Cell Phone Central LLC, Viet Huang, and Hung Vong Supermarket do their loading on 12th Street, 11th Street, or in the Wing Phat Plaza parking lot. All are primarily concerned with customer parking.

U-Haul has a parking lot but uses Washington Avenue as well as side-streets for truck storage. **Whether** parking should remain untimed is up for discussion with Council and neighbors.











The following responded to the survey:

Penske and Enterprise both have off-street parking lots that they can and do use for deliveries and loading. Penske does use some street parking for truck storage and states they would like to maintain free all-day parking. Enterprise has the same preference.

U-Haul has a parking lot but uses Washington Avenue as well as side-streets for truck storage. **Whether** parking should remain untimed is up for discussion with Council and neighbors.

All the businesses on this block currently use the spaces out front for loading, unloading, and/or vehicle storage. The Rock School has painted the curb in front of their building yellow and puts cones out during student pick-up and drop-off. We propose to formalize the loading activities that are already occurring, with timed loading zones that switch to parking during off-hours.





Washington Avenue East Existing & Proposed Number of Spaces*



Intersection Design & Parking Impacts

The chosen cross-section will determine the design of each intersection. **Some intersection designs will have** a greater impact on parking than others.



The 3-Lane cross section allows for bus boarding islands on both sides of Washington Avenue.

This configuration has a minimal impact on parking.



Intersection Design & Parking Impacts

The chosen cross-section will determine the design of each intersection. **Some intersection designs will have** a greater impact on parking than others.



The 4-Lane cross section requires that buses curb on one side of the street, which requires additional parking loss at the corners for bus clearance and bike lane sightlines.



Summary & Next Steps

Summary & Take Away

Although parking loss is expected, **parking capacity will increase** with timed parking, **deliveries will have dedicated space** to load and unload, and **neighbors will be able to park overnight** in spaces that current see little or no turnover on an average day.

The parking and loading proposed balances the stated desires of businesses to maintain free parking with what analysis shows is necessary for appropriate turnover on Washington Avenue.

These parking & loading changes can be implemented regardless of what cross-section is eventually chosen for Washington Avenue.



Follow-Up & Ongoing Communication

- Inform key stakeholders of the survey results.
- Make survey results available online.
- Review block-by-block parking and loading with businesses to finetune things like specific hours for loading zones.
- Determine preferred cross-section and prepare Engineering Plan.
- Continue regular communications before, during, and after paving in 2021.
