However, likely due to liabilities and habitability concerns, many landlords retain responsibility over water payments to prevent terminations via non-payment. With data gathered from a September 2017 email from the WRB and the 2016 American Community Survey, an estimated 5.5% of renteroccupied households in Philadelphia are the primary water account holders. To see the benefits of such a program, tenants must initiate change to potentially unfavorable parties, for reasons stated above.
