The 2020-2021 school year was proof that we can persevere and conquer in times of uncertainty. As a program, we were resilient and consistent with our students, but we would not have been able to do it without the tireless support of school leaders, educators, and staff. Together, we were more powerful and supported and empowered students through the challenges and limitations presented by COVID-19, the civil unrest, the social and racial inequities nationally and at home, and other uncertainty students faced.

Although we weren't in person, our program was converted and adapted into a virtual setting. Like everyone else, we found the best methods to communicate effectively and streamline services. We made sure our teams were prepared and flexible to school needs. We established a cadence for classroom push-ins, open office hours, workshops, and events, with support from educators and school leaders. As a result, our coaches met with students in group and one-on-one settings to complete many program tasks on post-secondary readiness, academic support, and Naviance modules.

We had a mission to support all 655 students assigned to our program, and we made sure to exhaust all avenues to do just that. We facilitated and supported many events, from the FAFSA kick-off to resume and career workshops and from chess games to providing graduates with gift bags. Overall, we are grateful to have been a part of the support system for our four schools and to have connected with the students we serve. This year, we simply did our best with each and every unique situation, and our students are better for it. We aim to exceed those heights next year and hope that conditions continue to improve so we may safely connect inperson.

OVERVIEW

During the 2020-2021 school year, 20 College & Career Coaches (CCC's) were placed at four West Philadelphia high schools to implement the Promise Corps program.

CCC's served 645 students in grades 10-12. On average, Promise Corps students received 114 program hours during 1:1 support from their Coach in the areas of Academic Assistance, College and Career Advising, and Naviance Support.

Across all four sites, a total of 2,980 individual or small group sessions were held with students.

OBJECTIVE

The mission of Promise Corps is to contribute to high-quality schools by holding rigorous expectations of students, serving as college-going role models, and collaborating powerfully with teachers, parents, and the broader community.

Promise Corps CCC's offer workshops and individual advising sessions to prepare students for four major post-secondary pathways: college and vocational schools, career and internships, national service opportunities, and the military.

We have included student goals throughout this report as a glimpse into the ambitions of some of our young adults.








2020 – 2021 Progress Report West Philadelphia High School
