63.71% of calls are treated, transported by EMS. Nearly 0.11% of the patients seen (according to PCRs) require no treatment. 4.18% of the patients (again, according to PCRs) refuse care.

2.43% of patient destination basis is by patient choice. 87.89% of the time it is based on closest facility and 0.14% of patients are transported to a destination based on patient's physician choice. 2.39% of the patients are transported to specialty resource centers.
