Serve VISTAs serve full-time for a year working on systems level change in City government. Our administration, led by Mayor Jim Kenny, has invested in a multi pronged approach—focused on stabilizing households, increasing skills and incomes, and investing in education— to lift residents out of poverty and to break the cycle for future generations. The work of Serve VISTAs is an important part of moving the City's anti-poverty strategy forward.

What do Serve VISTAs do?

Each VISTA position is unique to the City department or initiative, but all VISTAs will build capacity. Capacity building activities can include, but are not limited to:

- Creating tools, systems and guides like databases, policy briefs and marketing materials.
 Generating resources through partnerships, volunteers and/or grant-writing.
- Developing, organizing and/or assessing programs, events and/or meetings.
- Supporting, establishing or strengthening cross-departmental and cross-sector partnerships.

Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual disAbility Services, Chief Medical Officer Division

Healthy Futures: Access to Health Care

Project Goal

Nearly half of Philadelphians, approximately 735,000, are Medicaid recipients, many living at or below the poverty level. Often, Involuntary Commitment Petitions (302) are used to address unmet behavioral health challenges for this target population, especially for African Americans. Between 2003 and 2018, approximately 150,015 involuntary petitions were filed, and 121,147 of those individuals were Medicaid recipients, and 76,916 African Americans. The goal of this project is to reduce the unnecessary use of 302s to respond to behavioral health crisis and provide viable community based alternatives and reducing behavioral health disparities for Philadelphians.

VISTA Role

The VISTA will use data to create process improvement plans that will aid in avoiding unnecessary placements into higher levels of care such as inpatient hospitalization and involuntary commitments while improving patient flow through the Crisis System.

Key Activities - awaiting updates

- Work with CRC develop and implement process improvement to reduce the use of unnecessary involuntary commitment petitions (302)
- Track requests for 302 petitions through Philadelphia Crisis Line and concurrent mobile dispatches sent in response
- Use data collected to assess effectiveness of mobile team dispatches to respond to requests for 302 petitions
- Develop tracking mechanism for 988 (suicide hotline) calls and Philadelphia Crisis Line outreach and engagement activities for denied 302 petitions

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Evidence-Based Practice Racial Disparity VISTA

Project Goal

Evidence-based Practice and Innovation Center (EPIC) was established to advance system-wide strategies that support implementation, sustainability, and accessibility of behavioral health evidence-based practices (EBPs) in Philadelphia. The VISTA will support EPIC's mission of increasing access to EBPs for people receiving medical assistance and impacted by poverty, racism, and violence. Racial equity is a top priority and the VISTA will support the development and implementation strategies to address racial equity by engaging key stakeholders, conducting research on health disparities and guest speakers, and supporting the development of an EBP racial equity advisory board.

VISTA Role

The VISTA will support the integration of racial equity strategies in the public behavioral health system through training and event support, resource development, and communications.

Key Activities

- Conduct research and create resources to support the development of the evidencebased practice racial disparity advisory board
- Develop innovative communication strategies with behavioral health providers related to anti-racism practices and racial equity training
- Create mechanisms to assess the impact of racial equity training and related efforts to inform next steps and share with stakeholders
- Conduct research on behavioral health disparities

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External Integration VISTA

Economic Opportunity: Other, access to services

Project Goal

The Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual disAbility Services (DBHIDS) is committed to addressing the social determinants of health for people experiencing behavioral health challenges. We are particularly focused on housing security, food security, economic mobility, technology access and transportation. The VISTA will research best practices and will help to collect and analyze data for the pilot projects planned in 2022. After three years, the ultimate and sustainable outcome will be that the data collection methods and processes enacted by the VISTA will continue to be utilized indefinitely by our team, to help us monitor our project efficacy and equitable impact.

VISTA Role

The External Integration VISTA will contribute and add to the work already done this year to help collect and analyze data related to our projects and pilots that address technology access, food insecurity, employment, and transportation needs for our members.

Key Activities

- Support the External Integration team to collect, aggregate, and analyze data related to members involved in our social determinants of health (SDOH) projects, especially those that address food insecurity, employment, technology needs, and transportation access
- Collaborate with internal and external stakeholders across DBHIDS and other organizations to facilitate communication of information and data for metrics collection and analysis
- Create metrics and tools to measure and monitor outcomes, successes, and areas of opportunity

Project Goal

The Immigrant/Refugee Wellness Academy was created to achieve the following outcomes:

- Increase awareness and reduce behavioral health stigma among low-income, highrisk, and underserved immigrant/refugee communities through outreach and education
- Diversify the behavioral health workforce to reflect the City's population by providing employment opportunities for program participants to address the behavioral health challenges, trauma and inequity experienced within immigrant and refugee communities;
- Build system capacity and infrastructure for a continuum of care by supporting and giving local immigrant led organizations and providers serving immigrant and refugee communities reasonable compensation for their services

VISTA Role

The Immigrant/Refugee Wellness Academy VISTA support and contribute to the planning, implementation, and evaluation of the Immigrant/Refugee Wellness Academy.

Key Activities

- Assist with research and resource development and program implementation including program materials (flyer, brochure, reporting template, etc.)
- Disseminate approved program materials to the targeted audience and stakeholders
- Engage with stakeholders to ensure that action items are executed successfully
- Meet with the DEI Team program lead on a weekly basis to provide program updates and discuss corrective actions when needed

Education: School readiness and learning loss

Project Goal

The goal of this VISTA project is to improve Infant Toddler Early Intervention's (ITEI) capacity to identify potentially eligible infants and toddlers who are experiencing homelessness by supporting a collaboration between Infant Toddler Early Intervention and the Office of Homeless Services (OHS) along with OHS' community partner agencies. Through these developing collaborations, the VISTA will continue to better enable ITEI in leveraging available data systems, operate safely in the parameters of the pandemic, and successfully find, connect, and strengthen our outreach to vulnerable and impoverished families with young children.

VISTA Role

The Infant and Toddler Homelessness Resource VISTA will help Infant Toddler Early Intervention (ITEI) extend and evaluate our outreach and connections to families with infants and toddlers who are experiencing homelessness.

Key Activities

- Evaluate ITEI's efforts to identify infants and toddlers experiencing homelessness; adapt data collection methods and develop a template for analyses of this data
- Analyze incoming data reports from OHS via the Data Management Office
- Strengthen partnerships with housing sites and educate of staff about Infant Toddler Early Intervention services through the Early Intervention Families in Transition (EI-FIT) initiative
- Establish an annual training requirement for Service Coordinators and Early Interventionists to complete an on-line module about the Education for Children and Youth Experiencing Homelessness (ECYEH), a Philadelphia School District program

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Infant and Toddler Well-Being VISTA

Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual disAbility Services, Infant Toddler Early Intervention

Education: School readiness and learning loss

Project Goal

The Infant and Toddler Well-Being VISTA will support the Philadelphia Infant Toddler Early Intervention (ITEI) team to increase and sustain referrals to ITEI from the Philadelphia Department of Human Services (DHS) and its affiliates, the Community Umbrella Agencies (CUA). The VISTA will assist Infant Toddler Early Intervention to address the complexities that impact the establishment and sustainment of referrals from DHS. As the County Children and Youth Agency, DHS is involved with about 1000 infants and toddlers annually who are in out of home placements and are at special risk for developmental concerns. With DHS placement, research has shown that children's social emotional development is negatively affected at a higher rate.

VISTA Role

The Infant and Toddler Well-Being VISTA will help vulnerable children and their families involved with Philadelphia's Department of Human Services connect with Philadelphia Infant Toddler Early Intervention.

Key Activities

- Develop an analysis of the aggregate numbers of children referred by DHS and each CUA to determine gaps and trends in these agency referrals to ITEI and assist in establishing a feedback loop
- Evaluate ITEI's effectiveness in connecting children in out of home placements referred by DHS and CUAs with evidence-based interventions within ITEI
- Assist with an evaluation of the Good Faith Effort Policy to minimize ITEI's loss of contact with families whose infants and toddlers were referred by DHS
- Engage with DHS and their contracted agencies about referrals to ITEI for families who are receiving DHS Prevention Services

Project Goal

The Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual disAbility Services is in the third year of implementing our strategic plan, <u>P.A.C.E.: Prioritizing to Address our Changing Environment</u>. The Internal Integration VISTA will support the implementation of the strategic plan. In CY 2022, we will complete a needs assessment of our work to identify areas that our strategic plan needs to include that align better with our lens to Address Trauma, Achieve Equity and Engage Community. We also seek to align our strategic plan with our Social Determinants of Health lens that underpins a majority of challenges experienced by the people we serve and those in poverty.

VISTA Role

This VISTA will support the work of our Systems Integration Unit to integrate and implement the DBHIDS P.A.C.E. (Prioritizing to Address Our Changing Environment) Strategic Plan which prioritizes Prevention & Early Intervention, Treatment & Services, Health Economics, Infrastructure & Intelligence, and Innovation.

Key Activities

- Develop a communications plan to implement any updates to the strategic plan throughout the department
- Create an update document showing the progress DBHIDS made in FY22 in our strategic plan using data for each of the 60+ projects.
- Support the centralization of data collection throughout the Department under the Strategic Plan.

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PHL PreK Social Emotional Support VISTA

Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual disAbility Services, Infant Toddler Early Intervention

Education: School readiness and learning loss

Project Goal

The PHL PreK Social Emotional Support VISTA will assist with the establishment and evaluation of the Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual Disability Services' (DBHIDS) effort to support children in Philadelphia Pre-K programs who are experiencing social emotional and behavioral concerns. The PHLpreK team provides direct support to families and Early Learning Center staff to address gaps in services and provide supports. The Social Emotional Support PHLpreK VISTA will assist the PHLpreK team to develop and evaluate a protocol for effectively addressing the social emotional and behavioral concerns of young children and intervene to disrupt the preschool to prison pipeline that often starts with expulsion in preschool.

VISTA Role

The Social Emotional Support for PHLpreK VISTA will assist in developing a model and protocol for addressing the social emotional and behavioral concerns of young children in PHLpreK, including protocols related to teleintervention.

Key Activities

- Support policy development and practice that meets the requirements of Pennsylvania's Office of Child Development and facilitate the collaboration with existing public and private partners including Community Behavioral Health
- Assist in the design and development of data collection, progress reporting, and the evaluation of the effectiveness of this effort
- Engage potential State, City and community sponsors to integrate and sustain this effort when the grant funding for this initiative ends
- Develop policies and protocols, including those related to tele-intervention, that are sustainable and transferrable to future sponsors of this effort

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Reimagined Internship Project VISTA

Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual disAbility Services, Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion - Division of Planning Innovation

Economic Opportunity: Employment/Workforce Development

Project Goal

Internships enhance a student's education and employability. However, unpaid internships are a barrier for low-income individuals and communities. These students may opt for paid positions that do not enhance their professional development. The DBHIDS Reimagined Internship project will expand and diversify the Department's workforce and ensure that students are receiving impactful experiences that prepare them for future job opportunities. There will be targeted recruiting for underserved communities that will ensure that the DBHIDS workforce is representative of Philadelphia residents. The VISTA will work on building the capacity of DBHIDS to provide an equitable and inclusive internship experience.

VISTA Role

The DBHIDS Reimagined Internship Project VISTA will be contributing to the development of a coordinated internship process and the creation of a centralized system to manage internship opportunities, student recruitment and monitor defined objectives.

Key Activities

- Work with the team to define overall program strategy including internship and recruitment process, as well as marketing approach
- Assist with meeting logistics including meeting scheduling, prep and follow up
- Engage internal and external stakeholders including vendors and academic institutions to ensure that action items are executed

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Trauma Work Coordination VISTA

Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual disAbility Services

Healthy Futures: Access to Health Care

Project Goal

DBHIDS wants to make resources to address and mitigate trauma accessible to those individuals and communities in need of support. The experience of poverty alone is traumatic and long-lasting. Add on top of this the traumatizing and stigmatizing nature of the behavioral health system. The Systems Integration Unit works to address trauma within the system, as well as direct trauma.

VISTA Role

The Trauma Work Coordination VISTA will support the work of our Systems Integration Unit to address trauma within the system, as well as direct trauma experienced by Philadelphians through organizing available resources, recommending additional resources, developing a communications strategy to implement these resources across the City, and supporting the organization and facilitation of meetings with external stakeholders.

Key Activities - awaiting updates

- Support recruitment and facilitation of external stakeholder group to inform City-led efforts to address trauma
- Work with the central diversity equity and inclusion office to build out a healing circles initiative and specific geographical location providing for a place-based trauma strategy
- Assist with development and deploy communication strategy that will include all City departments that deal with health and human services, as well as local-level strategies to include community-based org and community leaders

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African & International Diaspora Community Engagement VISTA *Department of Commerce*

Economic Opportunity, Other, Access to Services

Project Goal

The fastest-growing group of foreign-born Philadelphians from 2000 - 2016 came from Africa. The Citywide African immigrant population is close to 25,000; and the majority of them live in underserved neighborhoods with an average rate of living below the Federal Poverty Line. The Vista will work with the Commerce Department and community partners to engage with African and diaspora communities and neighborhoods, to identify their needs with regards to entrepreneurship development and connections to economic opportunities, and to ultimately create the foundation for the City to better design programs to support diaspora immigrant-owned businesses.

VISTA Role

The African & International Diaspora Community Engagement VISTA will serve as a municipal ambassador, possessing strong linguistic and cultural awareness to engage in the African / Diaspora community and analyze their needs for entrepreneurship development

Key Activities

- Gathering data about targeted diasporas: neighborhood locations, socio-economic characteristics, correlations with poverty & near poverty levels, civic organizations
- Research best practices and existing programs aimed at bridging the gaps between diasporas and international trade and investments
- Design outreach towards international economic development partners and identified civic organizations to accurately map out existing services and gaps

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Strategic Engagement VISTA *Department of Labor*

Economic Opportunity, Other, Access to Services

Project Goal

The Strategic Engagement VISTA will build structural capacity for the Office of Worker Protections and will prioritize the Fair Workweek law, a labor law that protects fair scheduling and increases economic security for certain service retail and hospitality workers. Shortfalls in weekly work hours (under employment), low wages, wage and job protection and lack of access to benefits fuel poverty. Over three years, sustainable outcomes look like increased worker protection resources, strengthened partnerships, and increased presence of the office on public platforms.

VISTA Role

The Strategic Engagement VISTA will build structural support for public engagement on the City's labor laws, many of which have passed in the last 5 years.

Key Activities

- Develop resources for Fair Workweek engagement
- Expand language access resources by bottom lining language translations of documents, organization and informing stakeholders of how to access these resources
- Strengthen partnerships with labor and community groups around Fair Workweek by creating a Fair Workweek implementation round table
- Increase office presence in social media and public media outlets by building resources, posting, and coordinating with public media outlets
- Represent the office at community events or trainings

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FDR Park Economic Opportunity VISTA

Department of Parks and Recreation

Economic Opportunity, Other, Access to Services

Project Goal

FDR Park is South Philadelphia's largest park and one of its most important institutions, serving as a gathering space for many immigrant communities. For decades, FDR Park has been home to a vibrant vendor community serving as an economic lifeline for many immigrant families. Today, over 60 Asian and Latin American vendors work in FDR Park. Vending community leaders formed the Vendor's Association of FDR Park with support from Park Staff. This VISTA position provides organizing support for the Park and the Association, offering vendors technical support and assistance with navigating city regulations. Our goal is to improve economic opportunity through an organized and empowered vendor community at FDR Park.

VISTA Role

The VISTA will support, organize, and empower FDR Park's immigrant entrepreneur community through a new partnership with Park Staff and the Vendor's Association of FDR Park.

Key Activities

- Assist the FDR Park Vendor's Association and their community partners as they work through a department supported planning process to improve and legitimize community food vending in FDR Park.
- Develop basic administrative and communications systems to support the vendor community
- Serve as a liaison to support partnership and dialogue between Park Staff and the vendor community
- Work with Park Staff and the Vendor's Association to assist individual vendors in navigating city and park regulations

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FDR Park Workforce Development VISTA Department of Parks and Recreation

Economic Opportunity: Employment/Workforce Development

Project Goal

FDR Park is South Philadelphia's largest park and one of its most important public institutions, reflecting this community's remarkable racial, cultural and economic diversity. FDR Park is developing a youth empowerment and career readiness program providing paid internship opportunities for South Philadelphia teens from low income households. This program launched in Summer 2021 and will provide employment, training and mentorship to prepare these teens for college and for careers in natural lands conservation and park management. VISTA's will have the opportunity to help at this developmental stage with research of best practices, program design, outreach efforts to low income communities, and direct support to our teaching staff.

VISTA Role

The VISTA will develop and implement a youth empowerment and workforce readiness program, working with a racially and culturally integrated cohort of young people in service of one of Philadelphia's most vibrant and diverse public parks.

Key Activities

- Review youth program curriculum from 2021; develop and expand the program curriculum for 2022
- Explore partnerships with other South Philadelphia youth and workforce organizations to support continued education, employment, and mentorship opportunities for our youth cohort
- Utilize our expanding network of partners to support outreach and recruitment to identify youth for the 2022 and 2023 cohort
- Collaborate with Park Staff and PowerCorps fellows to develop enriching conservation and service projects in support of our diverse park communities

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A Running Start - Health VISTA

Department of Public Health, Division of Maternal, Child, & Family Health

Healthy Futures: Access to Health Care

Project Goal

Philadelphia social service staff provide supportive services to many families living in poverty. The goal of the "Family Health Training Academy" is to educate these staff so they can provide health education and referral information to families they serve. The A Running Start – Health VISTA will work with subject-matter experts to produce training e-modules, add them to various video-sharing platforms, promote the trainings, and design an evaluation plan. After 3 years, the "Training Academy" will be embedded into the training infrastructure of Philadelphia social service agencies through Learning Management Systems, onboarding materials, and employee newsletters.

VISTA Role

Manage and implement the "Family Health Training Academy," which aims to educate Philadelphia's front-line staff by producing family health-related "e-modules" to help provide health education and referral information to families they serve.

Key Activities

- Work with subject-matter experts to produce brief e-modules
- Collaborate with various agency training directors across the city to add e-modules to online training platforms
- Build and manage Training Academy "Resource Hub," which serves as a repository for family health resources, ensure quality improvement by reviewing e-module feedback and making changes as needed

Health Equity VISTA

Department of Public Health, Division of Maternal, Child, & Family Health

Economic Opportunity, Other, Access to Services

Project Goal

Many of the families served by Philadelphia Department of Public Health (PDPH), Division of Maternal, Child, and Family Health (MCFH) programs experience poverty. Poverty and racism perpetuate health inequity and put families at risk for negative health outcomes such as maternal and infant mortality. The VISTA will sustain a health equity workshop series and training, a health equity committee, and health equity metrics for MCFH. These activities will help MCFH build internal capacity to better serve children and families. Staff will learn about the relationship between health equity, structural racism, and maternal and child health outcomes, and make improvements on incorporating a health justice lens to all programmatic and internal work.

VISTA Role

The Health Equity VISTA will support the MCFH efforts of infusing health equity practices into all programming for families and communities in Philadelphia through workshops, trainings and carrying out the MCFH Strategic Plan.

Key Activities

- Work with the Data and Surveillance Team to develop an evaluation tool; create and implement a distribution plan for results

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Immigrant Outreach Program VISTA Department of Revenue

Economic Opportunity: Housing

Project Goal

We estimate that more than 105,000 eligible households don't participate in Real Estate Tax assistance, including the Homestead Exemption (worth up-to \$629 every year) and the Low-income Senior Tax Freeze. We believe that immigrant communities are especially vulnerable due to a lack of easy access to tax relief and rising property assessments in rapidly changing neighborhoods. We plan to use a VISTA to test engagement strategies that spur these communities to participate in tax assistance programs. It is especially critical to keep housing affordable now, while Philadelphians navigate pandemic-related disruptions. Ultimately, the VISTA will produce a road map of best practices that Revenue can incorporate into existing outreach efforts.

VISTA Role

The VISTA will implement the data-driven outreach project designed in FY22 to improve tax assistance program enrollment with partner community groups. They will document and maintain all data and material created through the project cycle, and work with staff to develop an evaluation strategy to track outreach outcomes.

Key Activities

- Expand outreach strategies: review past materials, develop metrics to track community engagement, and create outreach materials informed by stakeholders
- Collaborate with staff and partner community groups to develop a timeline for implementation of the program and support the program roll-out
- Work with the Mayor's Policy Office to design an evaluation strategy that highlights outreach, outcomes, and areas for future improvement

The Housing Policy and Partnerships VISTA will evaluate the effectiveness of recently launched efforts to serve low-income renters, while simultaneously researching best practices and recommending future interventions, including the relation of health to quality, affordable housing.

Healthy Futures: Access to Health Care

Project Goal

The most common reason for reports to the child welfare system in Philadelphia is for concerns over neglect (70% of reports) and come from neighborhoods with high rates of poverty and resource deprivation. Entering foster care can be a crisis for the child and cause lifelong impacts. The Crisis Access Link Model (CALM) will create critical paths of connection between the child welfare and behavioral health systems for youth/caregivers experiencing heightened stressors and crisis situations by adding additional staff within Community Behavioral Health's existing Child Mobile Crisis Teams to serve youth at risk for, or have recently experienced, removal from their home for safety reasons. The CALM VISTA will help transform children's behavioral health crisis services to provide connections to interventions to youth entering foster care. Ultimately, the VISTA will increase this intervention's capacity to stabilize youth so that the effects of child welfare involvement and poverty are decreased.

VISTA Role

The CALM VISTA will help expand the scale of population served by the children's behavioral health crisis teams to include youth in the child welfare system, by supporting the creation of processes to implement the new model across multiple agencies and partners.

Key Activities

- Review and analyze program information and data from the rollout of the first childwelfare specific crisis team to plan for and provide suggestions for changes for additional teams city-wide
- Research sustainable funding sources
- Research best practices for providing psychoeducation about trauma's impacts for youth in the child welfare system
- Create programmatic documentation for internal and external audiences
- Support project management of program implementation

This project will create a strategy for identifying and reaching out to the most economically vulnerable small landlords, targeting those with low incomes and/or language or cultural barriers. The project will involve research and program design. The outcomes will include a network of small landlords, tested materials and tools to be maintained going forward, and recommended procedures that can be replicated or scaled.

VISTA Role

The VISTA will conduct research on small, economically vulnerable landlords in Philadelphia (including those with limited English proficiency) and develop an effective communication strategy to increase their access to information and capacity, with the long-term goal of improving their ability to offer quality, affordable housing opportunities to Philadelphia renters.

Key Activities

- Review any relevant literature on small landlords and research national best practices on outreach and communication
- Conduct interviews with key informants representing targeted communities and stakeholders
- Convene 2-3 focus groups of small landlords
- Prepare a final report summarizing findings and outlining a draft pilot project

Education: K-12 success in low-achieving schools

Project Goal

The PromiseCorps College&Career Readiness program, founded in 2015, was a response to West Phila's PromiseZone (WPPZ) designation. With a poverty rate of 48%, higher than the citywide rate of 26.3%; 45% of households in the WPPZ earn less than \$15K annually. The VISTA will create data collection & analysis tools that will track program impact, allow the program to address areas of improvement & better support youth after they matriculate from school; something that no local org or the Philadelphia School District does well.

VISTA Role

The Youth Strategies Data and Evaluation VISTA will work to strengthen and create new systems and data collection tools to best track youth focused program impact and outcomes during a young person's high school experience and beyond.

Key Activities

- Conduct research on current data collection tools, systems, and processes that track high school student progress
- Provide a comprehensive evaluation of strategies for better aligned, efficient and strengthened systems of data collection and impact collection tools.
- Identify policy and programmatic impacts of improved data collection and evaluation
- Create an outreach campaign to engage and support Promise Corps program participants
- Support external communications and build relationships with post-secondary education stakeholders

Project Goal

The project focus for the VISTA is Economic Opportunity, and they will assist expansion of homeless housing resources, coordination and integration of systems, and implementation of quality improvement processes by creating learning opportunities for direct-service personnel, and shelter and housing providers, who comprise the Philadelphia Continuum of Care.

VISTA Role

The VISTA's primary role will be developing training resources to create learning opportunities for OHS staff and provider network.

- Research key training areas for content development

Economic Opportunity: Employment/Workforce Development

Project Goal

The Homeless population of Philadelphia face many challenges along with the lack of employment opportunities. Philadelphia needs to improve the capacity of their employment programs to meet the growing needs of the homeless population and cross-sector collaboration to make the appropriate resources and opportunities available. The Workforce Development VISTA will work to create new strategies and help build the capacity of employment programs targeting the vulnerable homeless population of Philadelphia.

VISTA Role

The VISTA will create new strategies and help build the capacity of employment programs targeting the vulnerable homeless population of Philadelphia.

Key Activities

- Assess employment needs of specific homeless populations: young adults (focus group, ages 18-24), parenting youth, and single youth
- Utilize data and feedback to recommend strategies to increase capacity of the employment program and remove barriers to employment
- Design a work readiness plan for individuals who are at risk of homelessness at the access points; design employment strategies for people in shelters
- Collaborate and liaise with staff and employment referral agencies on shared goals, gather and disseminate relevant information, and support the development of cross-system initiatives
- Work with OHS Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) team to identify data trends, design data tracking process for employment income and employment outcomes for the homeless population
- Identify opportunities for improvement in the strategic plan to increase the capacity of employment programs

Healthy Futures: Food Security

Project Goal

The 2021 Point in Time Count found approximately 2,715 individuals living in emergency housing and 700 unsheltered people in Philadelphia. According to Feeding America, the rate of food insecurity in Philadelphia is projected to increase from 14.4% in 2019 to 17% in 2021. The Office of Homeless Services procures and distributes food to 31 emergency shelters and 28 emergency meal sites in Philadelphia. The VISTA will work on systematizing feedback from shelter residents and meal guests and create structures to support shelter providers and OHS staff in implementing resident recommendations.

VISTA Role

The Food Services Engagement VISTA will use shelter residents' input on shelter meal services to create structures to continually gather and implement resident recommendations into meal programming at shelters.

Key Activities

- Develop standards for gathering consistent shelter resident meal service recommendations, learning from FY22 resident surveys and focus groups.
- Establish and incorporate guidelines for implementing shelter resident and provider feedback into shelter meal services and the Office of Homeless Services' Request for Proposal process for food service management companies and food ordering practices
- Create an evaluation tool to measure how shelter residents' meal service recommendations are incorporated.
- Evaluate the OHS warehouse's current inventory system and food ordering practices; Advise process improvements that meet residents' needs and balances cultural relevance, nutrition, and taste

- Excellent research, writing, and communication skills

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Immigrant Community Capacity Building VISTA

Office of Immigrant Affairs

Economic Opportunity: Other, Access to Services

Project Goal

As we have learned through the COVID-19 pandemic, the vitality of the immigrant community in Philadelphia depends on the government's ability to partner with community-based organizations that provide key culturally competent services. Black immigrant communities in Philadelphia face issues of poverty, language access, trauma (as refugees), unequal access to quality and reliable health care and race-based discrimination. OIA seeks to support African and Caribbean immigrant serving organizations as vehicles for community growth and economic development. OIA will develop a capacity building collaborative to provide culturally competent technical assistance and organizational development tools to 15 organizations in a three year period.

VISTA Role

The VISTA will work with immigrant-led community-based organizations to increase their capacity to more effectively and efficiently serve the broad needs of African and Caribbean immigrants, refugees and asylees in Philadelphia.

Key Activities

- Research and develop best practices for capacity building models that can support the needs of small, grassroots community-based organizations and initiatives
- Serve as the monthly or bi-monthly convener of cohorts for check-ins and training opportunities
- Conduct outreach and build relationships with capacity building providers in our region and beyond that can support the cohort of small grassroots organization
- Work with capacity building partners to develop curriculum and training modules to support community-based organizations

Preferred Skills/Experiences

- Ability to take direction and responsibility for work portfolio
- Knowledge of nonprofit organizations and how they serve various communities
- Ability to build relationships with community leaders
- Ability to research resources for nonprofit organizations

Digital Equity VISTA

Office of Innovation and Technology

Economic Opportunity: Bridging the Digital Divide

Project Goal

The VISTA will address the digital equity needs of Philadelphia residents. It is estimated that 16% of Philadelphia households lack broadband internet, and income is the strongest determinant of access in Philadelphia; 29% of households with incomes under \$20,000 lack broadband. The City of Philadelphia is developing a Digital Equity strategy to focus on this challenge and the VISTA will work with city agencies, community groups, and other stakeholders to develop the processes and procedures required to implement the strategy. After three years of service, the VISTA will have created systems that enable more Philadelphians to get free or low-cost internet, devices, and the digital skills needed for full participation in society.

VISTA Role

The Digital Equity VISTA will develop the systems needed to implement, evaluate, and sustain Philadelphia's Digital Equity Plan.

Key Activities

- Design, gather, prepare, and analyze qualitative and quantitative data from the first year of the PHLConnectED initiative to provide internet access to K-12 households for the purpose of drafting recommendations for ongoing improvement
- Develop and maintain a compendium or playbook of informational fact sheets, city blog posts, and/or webinars related to workstream topics on digital equity
- Develop and maintain a policy and financial sustainability tracker to identify key policies across the federal, state, and local levels related to digital equity
- Design and stand up a resident and family Advisory Board to provide critical insight on programmatic decisions, and offer feedback on proposed initiatives and solutions aimed to address digital equity.

Economic Opportunity: Workforce Development

Project Goal

Returning citizens experience many barriers that keep them in poverty by limiting access to employment/career pathways to economic stability. Philadelphia needs better crosssector collaboration to make appropriate resources and opportunities available. The Reentry Workforce Development VISTA will help develop the capacity of reentry stakeholders & workforce development stakeholders to implement cross-system initiatives to connect more returning citizens to workforce dev. Opportunities including education, training, job placement, & career pathways.

VISTA Role

The Reentry Workforce Development VISTA will research best practices, liaise with the Office of Workforce Development and the Reentry Coalition's Employment Subcommittee to gather and disseminate information, and contribute to strategy development to launch the Office of Reentry Partnerships' workforce development efforts.

Key Activities

- Research best practices and practices in other jurisdictions for 1) employer engagement, 2) industry partnerships, and 3) workforce development services and program referral networks in the context of reentry.
- Liaise with the Office of Workforce Development and the Reentry Coalition's Employment Subcommittee to understand shared goals, gather and disseminate relevant information, and support the development of cross-system initiatives.
- Identify opportunities for resource building, training, and capacity-building of stakeholders including City departments, criminal justice agencies, Reentry Coalition providers, formerly incarcerated Philadelphians & workforce development stakeholders.

Education: School readiness and learning loss

Project Goal

The Food Policy Advisory Council (FPAC) connects Philadelphians and local government to address racism and inequities that dictate who has the power and resources to access and control our food, land, and labor. This VISTA project will design, pilot, and evaluate a communications and outreach program with/for members to listen, learn, and collaborate with residents who are most affected by food insecurity. Ultimately, the project will build a sustainable process for engaging and training residents who are most impacted by and wise about food inequities to lead and influence food policy in ways that make amends for historically racist and unjust policies.

VISTA Role

The FPAC Communications and Outreach VISTA will work with members of the Food Policy Advisory Council to develop a research-based, outreach and engagement process that amplifies the wisdom of residents who are most often marginalized in the food system and have wisdom from enacting community-based solutions to food injustices.

Key Activities

- Engage in personal reflection about the food system and food (in)justice; embark in discussion with others; conduct a literature review of anti-racist food policy, participatory action research, equitable engagement, and community empowerment Work with members of the Food Policy Advisory Council to plan and design a
- communications and outreach proposal that is just, achievable, and replicable
- Support community members to gather, enter, analyze, publish, and share qualitative and quantitative data through participatory methods rooted in their lived experience
- Record and reflect on the new process and what was learned
