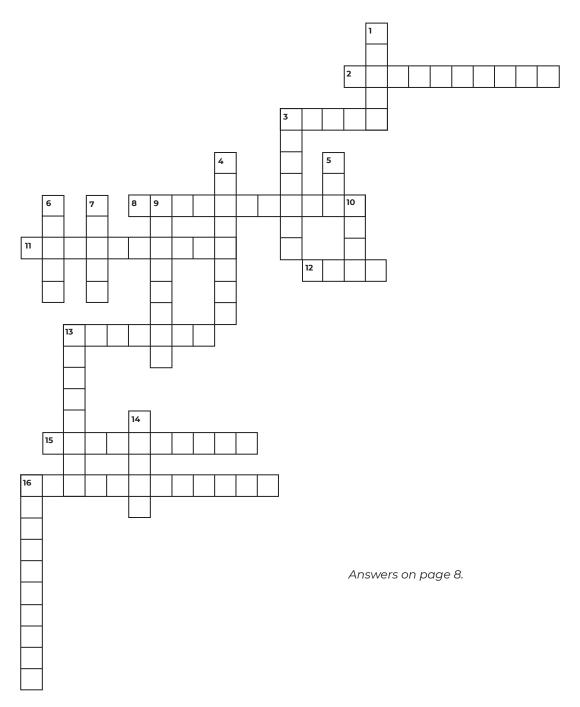

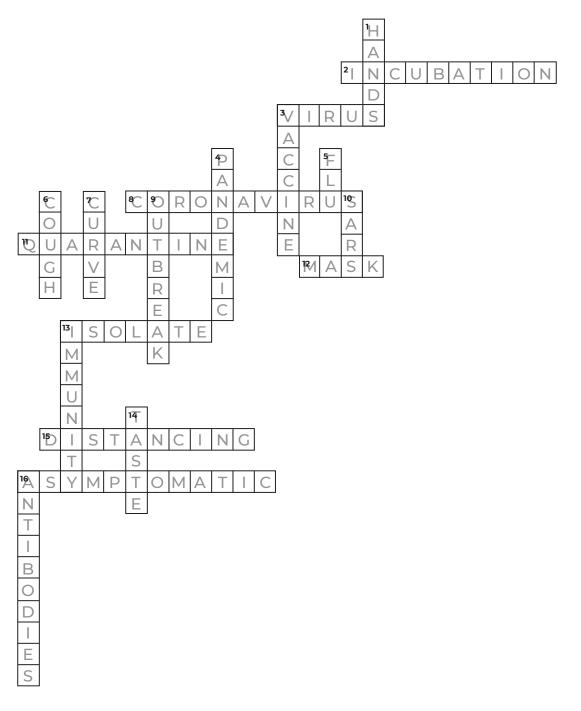
- F COVID-19 spreads when an infected person breathes out droplets and very small particles that contain the virus. These droplets and particles can be breathed in by other people or land on their eyes, noses, or mouth. It is not capable of entering your pores.
- T Diseases are named to enable discussion on disease prevention, spread, transmissibility, severity and treatment.
- F Hand sanitizers and soaps have been shown to be very effective at preventing the spread of COVID-19.
- F The age of a person is not an indicator of how severely they may become sick if infected with COVID-19.
- 5. T The evidence is clear that masks can help prevent the spread of COVID-19 and that the more people wearing masks, the better.
- 6. **F** COVID vaccines do teach your body how to fight the virus, but the vaccine does not alter your DNA.

- 7. **T** You may have some side effects, which are normal signs that your body is building protection.
- 8. T In general, reinfection means a person was infected (got sick) once, recovered, and then later became infected again. Based on what we know from similar viruses, some reinfections are expected. We are still learning more about COVID-19.
- 9. **F** If you're vaccinated, you're far less likely to contract COVID-19, but it is not impossible.
