

SUBJECT: **Chapter 17-104, Slavery Era Business/Corporate Insurance Disclosure and Financial Reparations**

Philadelphia Law requires the completion of the “Affidavit Disclosing Slavery Era Participation, Investments, or Profits” for all contractors entering into contracts with the *City of Philadelphia* or City-related Agencies, and for depositories authorized to receive City deposits. Specifically, Philadelphia Code Sec. 17-104(2), titled “Slavery Era Business/Corporate Insurance Disclosure and Financial Reparations,” requires this information to promote public transparency regarding the slavery era practices of entities with whom the City does business. The affidavit is required immediately upon execution of a contract with the City or a City-related Agency and failure to provide the affidavit, or providing materially false information on the affidavit, renders the contract voidable at the City’s option.

For Fiscal Year 2022, Public Works (“PW”) and Services, Supplies, and Equipment (“SS&E”) contracts were awarded to one hundred and thirty-three (133) registered vendors. Eighty-three percent (83%) of these vendors affirmed, “The Business Entity found no records that the Business Entity or any of its Predecessor Companies had any Participation or Investments in, or derived Profits from, Slavery or Slaveholder Insurance Policies during the Slavery Era”. The remaining seventeen (17%) of these vendors, did not provide a complete affidavit. The City of Philadelphia has been in contact with vendors to receive their completed affidavits.

The Procurement Department is working with staff to ensure responsiveness and completeness review of the Slavery Affidavits prior to awarding a contract.
