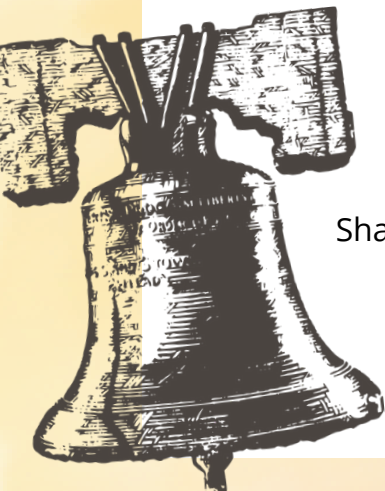
Join the Mayor's Volunteer Corps!

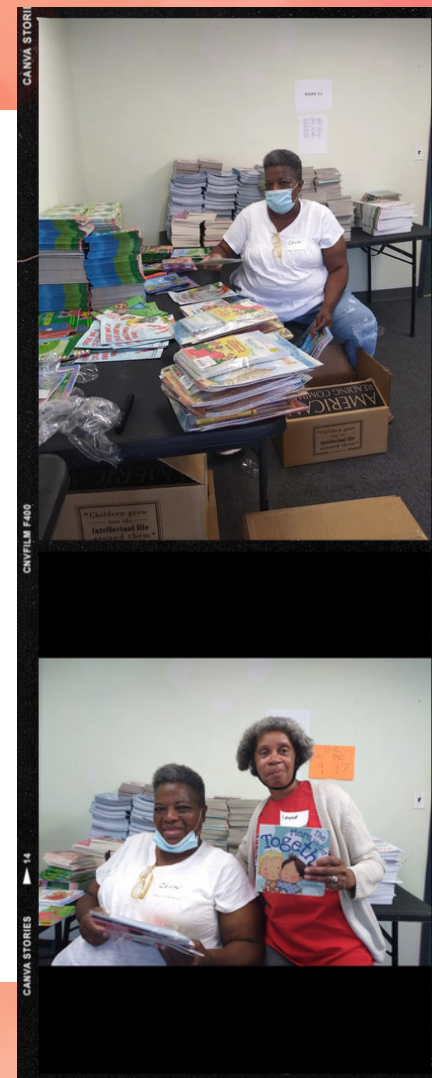


I volunteered with Read by 4th's Reading Promise Week, Philadelphia's family literacy festival.

Over the past 11 months, I volunteered with the Mayor's Office of Civic Engagement and Volunteer Service's Community Resource Corps AmeriCorps Program.

One of my favorite experiences has been with Fairmount Behavioral Hospital where I engaged with community members who seek in-patient drug and alcohol rehabilitation. This topic hits extremely close to home for me. Every moment that went by during my time spent with these amazing individuals, I felt myself growing and learning things about myself as a human being that I will always remember and cherish.

Some days, I sat in groups with 10 - 15 guys who all wanted to improve ourselves and gain the insight, knowledge, and tools necessary to live happy, fulfilled lives without the use of drugs and alcohol.

Other days, I would put on a pair of medical gloves, grab a paper shopping bag, and walk around the entire outdoor area picking up cigarette butts. I enjoyed being able to give back in this way. Sometimes, I would be joined by someone who just saw me cleaning and spontaneously decided to help. This would often lead to very deep yet therapeutic conversations with one another as we crouched around the courtyard and sidewalks and picked through blades of grass searching for every last piece of litter. Sometimes we laughed, sometimes we cried, and sometimes we shared things with each other that we have never spoke of to anyone else.

This was truly a life changing experience which I will always carry with me in my heart and soul.

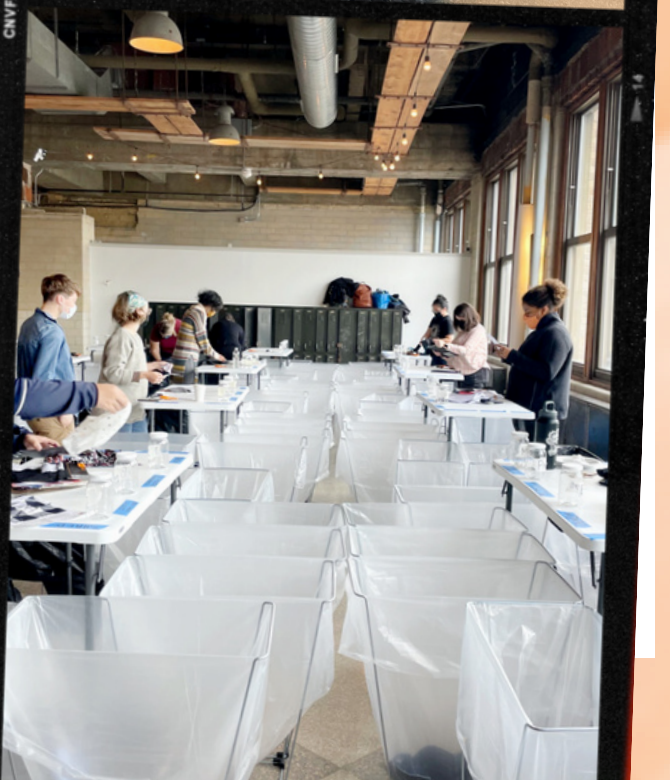
Let's hear from Local Organizations!
