


Why Safety Matters in Parkside




The Vision Zero High Injury Network (HIN): 80% percent of the fatal and serious injury traffic crashes in the City happen on 12% of Philadelphia streets.

Projects Underway Include:


- 1. Intersection improvements at 52nd St & Parkside and and 50th St & Parkside Avenue
- 2. New walking path along Parkside from 53rd St to Bryn Mawr Avenue
- New traffic light at 50th St & Parkside Avenue
- New concrete bus boarding islands 4. on Parkside Avenue
- Gateway signs and lighting at 52nd Street under train bridge
- New Parkside Cynwyd Trail 6.

CRASHES ON PARKSIDE AVE



On Parkside Avenue (41st - 52nd), there were **59 crashes** from 2018 to 2020. 4 crashes involved people walking, 9 crashes involved people biking.



1 person died and **2** were seriously injured from 2018 to 2021 on Parkside Avenue alone.

Route of planned Parkside Cynwyd Trail















Multimodal Transportation Fund Project

Construction on the project starts mid-October 2022 and will continue through Spring 2023.










