Serve Philadelphia VISTAs serve full-time (30 hours/week) for one year working on systems level change in City government.

Our administration has invested in a multi-pronged approach—focused on stabilizing households, increasing skills and incomes, and investing in education— to lift residents out of poverty and to break the cycle for future generations. The work of Serve Philadelphia VISTAs is an important part of moving the City's anti-poverty strategy forward.

What do Serve VISTAs do?

Each VISTA position is unique to the City department or initiative, but <u>all</u> VISTAs will build capacity.

Capacity building activities can include, but are not limited to:

- Creating tools, systems and guides like databases, policy briefs and marketing materials
- Generating resources through partnerships, volunteers and/or grant-writing
- Developing, organizing and/or assessing programs, events and/or meetings
- Supporting, establishing, or strengthening cross-departmental and cross-sector partnerships

Economic Opportunity: other (ex. access to reentry services, access to city services)

Project Goal:

The Budget Community Education & Engagement VISTA (BCEE VISTA) will boost capacity within the Budget Office's new Education, Engagement and Impact Unit (EEI) to help Philadelphia residents be able to see (educate), speak on (engage), and shape (impact) City spending more effectively and equitably. The EEI plays an important role in boosting citywide efforts to implement racial equity inquiry across the City Budget design. In addition, the EEI is tasked with piloting Philadelphia's first Participatory Budgeting (PB) campaign.

What You'll Do:

- Strategize, develop, and implement processes to advance the Participatory Budgeting (PB) Campaign and Budget Engagement

Project Goal:

Evidence-Based Practice and Innovation Center (EPIC) was established to advance system-wide strategies to support implementation, sustainability, and accessibility of behavioral health evidence-based practices (EBPs) in Philadelphia. The VISTA will support EPIC's mission of increasing access to EBPs for people receiving medical assistance and impacted by poverty, racism, and violence. The VISTA will support the implementation of strategies to address racial equity by engaging key stakeholders and supporting the team's Anti-Racism Coalition.

What You'll Do:

- Conduct research and create resources to support building the team's anti-racism coalition
- Develop innovative social media or marketing strategies with behavioral health providers related to antiracism practices and racial equity training

Healthy Futures: Access to Health Care

Project Goal:

Factors such as housing, employment, discrimination, poverty, and access to healthy food play a profound role in determining quality of life outcomes, including life expectancy, mortality rates and health status. DBHIDS requires a robust technology infrastructure to address these social determinants of health (SDOH). The HIPAA Security Project VISTA will help DBHIDS in fulfilling its obligations under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) to ensure the confidentiality and security of the Protected Health Information (ePHI) of the people it serves.

What You'll Do:

Ensure that all 2022 HIPAA Assessment risks have been addressed and documented. The VISTA will not be responsible for implementing any required technologies and/or security policies but, will play a project management role, ensuring that the activities of the DBHIDS team(s) are on track, in addition to producing reports and visualizations of progress.

The VISTA member will learn people management skills and will be expected to help facilitate team meetings amongst a diverse group of professionals.

Project Goal:

The Immigrant/Refugee Wellness Academy was created to achieve the following outcomes:

- Increase awareness and reduce behavioral health stigma among low-income, high-risk, and underserved immigrant/refugee communities through outreach and education
- Provide employment opportunities for program participants to diversify the behavioral health workforce and reflect the City's population, as well as address the behavioral health challenges, trauma and inequity experienced within immigrant and refugee communities
- Build system capacity and infrastructure for a continuum of care by supporting and giving local immigrant led organizations and providers serving immigrant and refugee communities reasonable compensation for their services

Support the development and implementation of a new cohort for the Immigrant and Refugee Wellness Academy.

Infant and Toddler Well-Being VISTA

Department of Behavioral Health & Intellectual disAbility Services (DBHIDS), Infant Toddler Early Intervention

Education: School readiness and learning loss

Project Goal:

The Infant and Toddler Well-Being VISTA will support the Philadelphia Infant Toddler Early Intervention (ITEI) team to increase and sustain referrals to ITEI from the Philadelphia Department of Human Services (DHS) and its affiliates, the Community Umbrella Agencies (CUA). The VISTA will assist ITEI to address a number of complexities that impact the successful establishment and sustainment of referrals from DHS and the CUAs. As the County Children and Youth Agency, DHS is involved with approximately 1000 infants and toddlers annually who are in out of home placements and are at special risk for developmental concerns due to early adversity. Research shows that social emotional development is negatively affected at a higher rate for children in DHS placements. As DHS continues to adapt its policies and practices to support families of very young children, ITEI wants to align with these improvements and be responsive to the needs of these very young children and their families.

What You'll Do:

The Infant and Toddler Well-Being VISTA will help vulnerable children and their families involved with Philadelphia's Department of Human Services connect with Philadelphia Infant Toddler Early Intervention.

Infant and Toddler Homelessness Resource VISTA Department of Behavioral Health & Intellectual disAbility Services (DBHIDS), Infant Toddler Early Intervention

Education: School readiness and learning loss

Project Goal:

Extreme poverty is the strongest predictor of homelessness and at least 11% of children living in poverty are homeless (American Psychological Association's Presidential Task Force, 2009). Unstable housing has a significant impact on early childhood development (Infants Exposed to Homelessness: Health, Health Care Use, And Health Spending from Birth to Age Six, 2019). Emergency and Transition Housing agencies have very limited resources to connect families to ITEI. Direct, on-site support by ITEI yielded a significant increase in the number of referrals. The VISTA will work with the ITEI team to develop and evaluate effective procedures to promote referrals of families in Emergency and Transitional Housing and for families that are diverted from these housing options or are in other temporary housing options.

What You'll Do:

Improve Infant Toddler Early Intervention's (ITEI) capacity to identify eligible infants and toddlers who are experiencing homelessness and support the collaboration between ITEI and the Office of Homeless Services (OHS) along with OHS' community partner agencies. Through these developing collaborations, the VISTA will enable ITEI to leverage available data systems and to successfully find, connect, and strengthen our outreach to vulnerable and impoverished with families with young children.

Project Goal:

The Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual disAbility Services is launching the use of the START Model, a community-based crisis intervention for individuals with intellectual disabilities, autism and mental health needs. With timely and needed supports, people with intellectual disabilities, autism and mental health needs have improved mental health, fewer restrictive hospital-based stays, and can more consistently and successfully live and work in their communities. The START VISTA will support the team to identify and integrate the programmatic and data-informed processes that will achieve and sustain these outcomes.

Trauma Work Coordination VISTA

Department of Behavioral Health & Intellectual disAbility Services (DBHIDS), Systems Integration

Healthy Futures: Access to Health Care

Project Goal:

DBHIDS wants to make resources to address and mitigate trauma accessible to those individuals and communities in need of support. The experience of poverty alone is traumatic and long-lasting, the current traumatizing and stigmatizing nature of the behavioral health system compounds the traumatic effects for folks seeking and receiving support within the system. The Systems Integration Unit works to address trauma within the system, as well as direct trauma.

What You'll Do:

- Support recruitment and facilitation of external stakeholder group to inform City-led efforts to address trauma
- Work with the Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion to build out a healing circles initiative and specific space for providing for a place-based trauma strategy
- Assist with development and deployment of a communication strategy to include all City departments that support health and human services, as well as community-based organizations and community leaders

Project Goal:

The Department of Commerce aims to serve as a primary resource for Philadelphia business data and research. The Community Engagement & Neighborhood Data Collection VISTA will update Commerce data set through inperson surveying of businesses on commercial corridors. The VISTA will analyze data results to recommend programs that would improve safety and generate wealth in communities.

Economic Opportunity: other (ex. access to reentry services, access to city services)

Project Goal:

The fastest-growing group of foreign-born Philadelphians from 2000 - 2016 came from Africa. The Citywide African immigrant population is close to 25,000; and the majority of them live in underserved neighborhoods with an average rate of living below the Federal Poverty Line. The VISTA will work with the Commerce Department and community partners to engage with African and diaspora communities and neighborhoods, to identify their needs with regards to entrepreneurship development and connections to economic opportunities, and to ultimately create the foundation for the City to better design programs to support diaspora immigrant-owned businesses.

What You'll Do:

- Engage with African and diaspora communities and neighborhoods (visits, interviews, and outreach)
- Identify community needs with regards to entrepreneurship development and connections to economic opportunities
- Create data analysis report of findings from community feedback to determine next steps in program design

Project Goal:

Philadelphia social service staff provide supportive services to many families living in poverty. The goal of the Family Health Training Academy is to educate these staff so they can provide health education and referral information to families they serve. The Children's Health VISTA will work with subject-matter experts to produce training e-modules, add them to various video-sharing platforms, promote the trainings, and design an evaluation plan. After 3 years, the Family Health Training Academy will be embedded into the training infrastructure of Philadelphia social service agencies through Learning Management Systems, onboarding materials, and employee newsletters.

Develop the Family Health Training Academy e-module library that trains front-line staff and caseworkers in Philadelphia on critical lessons that can help them serve their clients:

Economic Opportunity: Housing (esp. displacement due to COVID-19 and eviction prevention)

Project Goal:

As Philadelphia transitions from a majority homeowner to renter city, it is necessary to re-evaluate housing policies and programs to ensure affordable housing needs are met. Current initiatives are wide ranging but skew toward keeping homeowners in their homes, responding, in part, to the housing crisis of 10+ years ago. More recent changes have focused on the need to accommodate a highly vulnerable renter population.

What You'll Do:

- Evaluate the effectiveness of recently launched efforts to serve low-income renters
- Research best practices and recommend future interventions,
- Convene City and external partners to develop and implement new programs and initiatives
- Develop evaluation and data collection plans for related programs and initiatives
- Conduct and present best practice research and feasibility studies

Economic Opportunity: other (ex. access to reentry services, access to city services)

Project Goal:

FDR Park is South Philadelphia's largest park and one of its most important institutions, serving as a gathering space for many immigrant communities. For decades, FDR Park has been home to a vibrant vendor community serving as an economic lifeline for many immigrant families. Today, more than 60 Asian and Latin American vendors work in FDR Park. Vending community leaders formed the Vendor's Association of FDR Park with support from Park Staff. This VISTA position provides organizing support for the Park and the Association, offering vendors technical support and assistance with navigating city regulations. Our goal is to improve economic opportunity through an organized and empowered vendor community at FDR Park.

What You'll Do:

Support market leaders in their mission to build a strong Vendor's Association and advance the goal of a new, permanent and licensed marketplace at FDR Park:

- Collaborate with the FDR Park Vendor's Association and their community partners to navigate the planning process to improve and legitimize community food vending in FDR Park
- Develop & maintain basic administrative and communications systems to support the vendor community
- Serve as a liaison to support partnership and dialogue between Park Staff and the vendor community
- Work with Park Staff and the Vendor's Association to assist individual vendors in navigating city and park regulations

Project Goal:

FDR Park is South Philadelphia's largest park and one of its most important public institutions, reflecting this community's remarkable racial, cultural and economic diversity. FDR Park is developing a youth empowerment and career readiness program providing paid internship opportunities for South Philadelphia teens from low income households. This program launched in Summer 2021 and will provide employment, training and mentorship to prepare these teens for college and for careers in natural lands conservation and park management. VISTA's will have the opportunity to help at this developmental stage with research of best practices, program design, outreach efforts to low income communities, and direct support to our teaching staff.

What You'll Do:

- Develop and implement a youth empowerment and workforce readiness program for a racially and culturally inclusive cohort
- Review youth program curriculum from 2022; develop and expand the program curriculum for 2023
- Explore partnerships with other South Philadelphia youth and workforce organizations

Economic Opportunity: Employment/Workforce Development

Project Goal:

The VISTA will support a mission to transform miles of riverfront brownfields into trails and parks, free outdoor programs; "green" job skill training, and land restoration projects. The VISTA will support a volunteer and job skill trainee base by researching best volunteer management practices, program design, direct engagement, and direct support of community activities. Intended, sustainable outcomes include:

- A growing base of community volunteers
- Residents of nearby neighborhoods use their riverfront parks as a resource of livable, vibrant communities
- PowerCorps PHL job skill trainees receive hands-on experience in urban forestry
- Sustained management of an award-winning public land restoration project that has planted 1,500 native trees and managed 10 acres of coastal plain forest with community partners

Safe Routes Philly VISTA

Managing Director's Office - Office of Transportation, Infrastructure and Sustainability (OTIS)

Education: School readiness and learning loss

Project Goal:

The Safe Routes Philly VISTA will work at 4 schools to train and support a team of teachers and staff who then work to encourage students to use active transportation. These methods, such as a walking school bus program and a traffic safety curriculum, can increase attendance and academic performance, helping to reduce learning loss and improve academic readiness. The cohort of schools from year 1 will be trained to recruit and mentor schools during subsequent years. The year 2 cohort will do the same. At the end of the project, the 12 schools supported by the VISTA will be positioned to train and mentor schools in the program beyond close out of the project.

- Be the main point of contact between 4 schools and the Safe Routes Philly office
- Visit each of the 4 schools once per week
- Establish and train a "Safe Routes Team" at each of the 4 schools
- Conduct a walk audit for each school with each Safe Routes Team and the SRP Coordinator
- Train and support each Safe Routes team to establish a walking school bus with its students

Managing Director's Office - Office of Transportation, Infrastructure and Sustainability (OTIS)

Economic Opportunity: other (ex. access to reentry services, access to city services)

Project Goal:

Proximity to transportation directly impacts access to economic opportunity and public services. This VISTA project will build upon Indego's existing community engagement strategy with a focus on Hispanic communities in North Philadelphia. By promoting the equitable expansion of Indego Bike Share in historically underserved communities, we plan to increase access to economic opportunities and public services.

What You'll Do:

Collaborate with the Indego bike share team to develop community relationships with a focus on Spanish outreach in Hispanic communities in North Philadelphia.
