RE: First Source Jobs Policy, Quarter IV 2022 Report

October 1, 2022 - December 31, 2022

Per the First Source Jobs Policy, Chapter 17-1900 of the Philadelphia Code, the Department of Commerce (designated by the Mayor as the "Designated Department" responsible for overall implementation and enforcement of the "First Source Jobs Policy") is submitting the fourth quarter report for calendar year 2022.

Since the implementation of the First Source Jobs Policy, the Department of Commerce has been aware of the three beneficiaries that are covered by and will comply with the First Source legislation. The original beneficiaries are:

- 1. Pennsylvania Real Estate Investment Trust (Fashion District of Philadelphia Project)
- 2. Orinoka Mills, L.P.
- 3. New Kensington Community Development Corporation

The Fashion District Project remains a tax increment financing (TIF) project, and the Orinoka Mills and New Kensington projects are below market rate land transactions.

To date, there have been no additional beneficiaries to the report since Quarter III. All projects continue to be tracked as needed and are set for hiring employees and transaction of business or services.

At the time of this report, which spans the period from *October 1, 2022, through December 31, 2022*, Philadelphia continues to experience ups and downs in the retail sector due to many factors. Due to the soft market, there are continued challenges in recruitment and hiring in many industries, particularly in the retail sector. There are signs of increased consumer shopping in center city, but there is more work to do to increasing the viability in the center city area. The Commerce Department continues to work with the Office

of the Managing Director, and the division of Public Safety to support economic development coordination to address the safety and access concerns that impact the city's retail businesses.

The PA CareerLink® system has adjusted its service delivery, outreach, and impact to recruit and refer viable candidates for hire to the Philadelphia business community. All parties continue to follow the City of Philadelphia's guidance on prevention measures and other resources for local businesses as it pertains to public health and safety. The Commerce Department business services teams are supporting and providing resources to all local businesses in addition to providing technical assistance and access to other supports as needed.

The Business Services Team and PA CareerLink® Philadelphia staff are working with jobseekers and connecting with employers virtually and in-person as the PA CareerLink® centers are open daily for appointments and inperson services. Virtual services are always available through the PA CareerLink® Portal for jobseekers and employers to ensure there are multiple points of access and connectivity. They continue to ensure all safety precautions and strategies are in place for jobseekers and employers to promote increased business and sales and revenue.

The PA CareerLink® Business Services team continues its due diligence regarding employer engagement and reaffirmation for all of the employer contacts last quarter. The PA CareerLink®, Philadelphia Works, and Commerce partners are planning a meeting with the Macerich team to reestablish their relationship. It is a priority to discuss the objectives and intent of the Jobs Registry, and the partnership due to the turnover of the Macerich management team, and to connect in a meaningful way to support the retail industry with talent through the First Source legislation.in Addition, PA CareerLink® Business Services team is working with Philadelphia Works to create a new process to engage the employers from the Fashion district with the hope that we can obtain new job orders that can be shared with Philadelphia residents.

Fashion District Update from Macerich, Inc.: *Highlighted new information

Carter's Clearance in Gallery II opened on 12/16/22, with great customer turnout. The new deals and openings in the 1st quarter are listed below. The standard lease contains the First Source Agreement for all permanent Tenants. The Macerich team makes new Tenants aware of the agreement early in the lease process by discussing it and sending out a marketing brochure on PA CareerLink®. Macerich supports Tenant compliance with the program and encourages tenants to reach out about their staffing needs, to take full advantage of this hiring resource. As of this writing, there were <u>3</u> new permanent, and <u>4</u> temporary leases signed during Q3/Q4 with openings scheduled as below:
