Crime Prevention & Response Tips

for your business & employees





Keep windows clear & shatter-resistant

- Keep windows free of signs, ads, and large coverings. Visibility helps police respond more quickly to emergencies.
- Keep indoor lights on overnight so that the public and police can easily see suspicious activity happening inside.
- Install see-through security grills, and shatter-resistant window films to add security without blocking visibility.



Protect business exterior

- Keep the front and back of your business well-lit at all times.
- Clearly mark the business name and street address on the front and back of your building so that police can respond more quickly to emergencies.

Security cameras

- Install and maintain a high-quality security camera system that fully covers the inside and outside of your business.
- •Keep recording equipment in a secure location.
- The Business Security Camera Program can help cover eligible costs of a camera system. Find more information on the following page or scan the QR code below.



Keep cash at a minimum

- Limit the amount of cash on site by accepting card and smartphone payments.
- Make frequent bank deposits but don't set a pattern that thieves could track.
- If larger sums of cash must remain on site, make frequent cash drops out of public view into a timed safe located in a secure and monitored location.



Robbery response

- If robbed, remain calm, cooperate, and do not resist. Your well-being and the safety of your employees and customers are more important than any losses.
- •Try to remember details about the robber and what direction they fled.
- •When it is safe to do so, lock your doors and call 911. Provide police with any camera footage, a list of losses, and requested information.



- If burglarized, call 911 immediately. Do not enter the building without a police officer because the burglar may still be inside. Do not touch anything because you could disturb potential evidence.
- Provide police with any camera footage, a list of losses, and requested information.
- Secure any damaged entry points or vulnerable areas and re-key locks.

Business Security Camera Program

The Business Security Camera Program encourages businesses to install exterior cameras on their commercial properties. Participants can receive up to 75 percent of the total eligible costs of a security camera system, up to \$3,000.
