



What is the **PEACE** Program?

“When our program could no longer meet Mr. Carson’s complex health needs, we turned to the **PEACE Program.**”

The PEACE Program is open to older adults, typically aged 55 or older, who have histories of homelessness and complex physical or behavioral health needs.

Program staff help them secure sustainable housing in personal care homes or skilled nursing facilities, where they can receive the specialized assistance they require.

Individuals need a referral to join the PEACE Program.

WHAT SERVICES DO WE PROVIDE?

- Help obtain the medical evaluations required for referrals.
- Make referrals to personal care homes, skilled nursing facilities, and community-based programs.
- After securing housing, monitor individuals for a full year to ensure that housing is sustained.
- After program completion
- Assist, direct, and guide providers that are making referrals as needed.
