About Rain Check:

In June 2012, the Water Department launched Rain Check, a program designed to encourage homeowners to install landscape improvements that manage stormwater.
Through Rain Check, the Water Department provides educational workshops, stormwater property assessments and/or consultations, and shares the cost of implementing one of three stormwater management tools on a participant's property including: downspout planters, rain gardens, and permeable pavers. Rain Check has also stimulated the creation of green jobs. Approximately 15 companies, representing over 25 individuals have enhanced their business through part-time stormwater management work through Rain Check. PWD also provides free rain barrels through this program.

Metrics:

Since July 2014, we've had 10,827 workshop attendees and have installed 4,411 rain barrels, 862 downspout planters, 101 rain gardens, and 413 permeable paver projects. *(metrics as of March, 2023)

Annual Reduction in Stormwater Volumes:

We do not collect these metrics.
