27		included in the Water Department's Water Revitalization Plan (WRP) totaling
28		approximately \$697 million. The \$340 million represents 49% of eligible project

costs. PWD is responsible for securing the remaining 51%, which PWD plans to fund using a combination of available cash and revenue bond financing.

PWD has entered into a Master Agreement with WIFIA under which loans will be issued in tranches. The first loan tranche which covers water main and service line replacement projects closed in January 2023. Subsequent loan tranches are projected to close in July 2023, 2024, 2025 and 2027.

Similar to PENNVEST, WIFIA loans work on a reimbursement basis and the associated funding is not received upfront.

- B. The projects included in the WIFIA Master Agreement are as follows:
 - 1. George's Hill Pump Station Replacement
 - 2. Belmont High Service Pump Station
 - 3. East Park Booster Pump Station
 - 4. Baxter Water Treatment Plant Storage
 - 5. Schuylkill River Crossing
 - 6. Monument Road Storage
 - 7. Belmont Water Treatment Plant Storage
 - 8. Distribution Main Replacement (consists of 11 water main replacements projects at various locations through out the City, lead service lines encountered during construction will be replaced).

C. As noted in response to PA-V-10, the cost of service study reflects the projected WIFIA financing, which is presented on Line 12 of Table 2-7 of Schedule BV-2: Water and Wastewater Cost of Service Report (the same table is presented in Schedule BV-1: Table C-9). The projected debt service reflects the WIFIA loan as well as the projected financing associated with the matching funds.

Per the State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan², of the \$240 Million, PENNVEST allocated:

- \$166 Million is available via the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund; and
- \$74 Million is available via the Clean Water State Revolving Fund.

As the Water Department does not meet PENNVEST's criteria for grant funding nor principal forgiveness, any funding sourced (in full or partially) from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Funding Act, would come in the form of a loan.

Note - there are "nearly 9,200 public water systems³" in Pennsylvania, and roughly the same number of wastewater systems.

26	Hazar	d Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) have the potential to result in grant funding.
27	At thi	s time, it is unclear how the Water Department would receive funding if awarded a
