## **RESPONSE:**

PLUG-I-2.

Yes, the \$2.9M reduction in Wholesale Wastewater revenues under existing wholesale fixed charges attributable to LTCPU allocations (a subset of Wholesale wastewater revenues) will be recovered from Retail Wastewater customers. Consistent with prior cost of service studies the Retail cost of service is the Wastewater System net revenue requirement less the wholesale wastewater cost of service. Please refer to response attachment PLUG-I-2 for the derivation of the estimated allocation of the \$2.9 million reduction under existing wholesale fixed charges.
