Kosa recently received notice from the Philadelphia Historical Commission (the "Commission") that its Property has been proposed for historic designation. I understand the nomination is scheduled to be considered at the March 15, 2023 meeting of the Committee on Historic Designation (the "CHD") and the Commission's regular meeting scheduled for April 14, 2023.

On behalf of Kosa, I am writing to respectfully request a 60-day continuance of the CHD and Commission's consideration of the nomination. Kosa only recently received notice of the nomination and requires additional time to research, analyze and consider the merits of the nomination in advance of any public meetings. No prejudice would result from the proposed continuance as the Property will remain under the Commission's jurisdiction during the pendency of the nomination as though it were designated.
