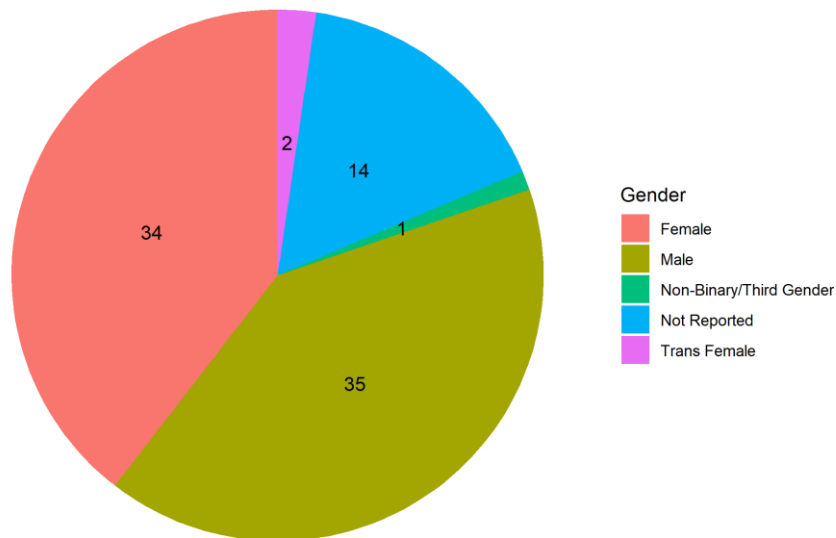

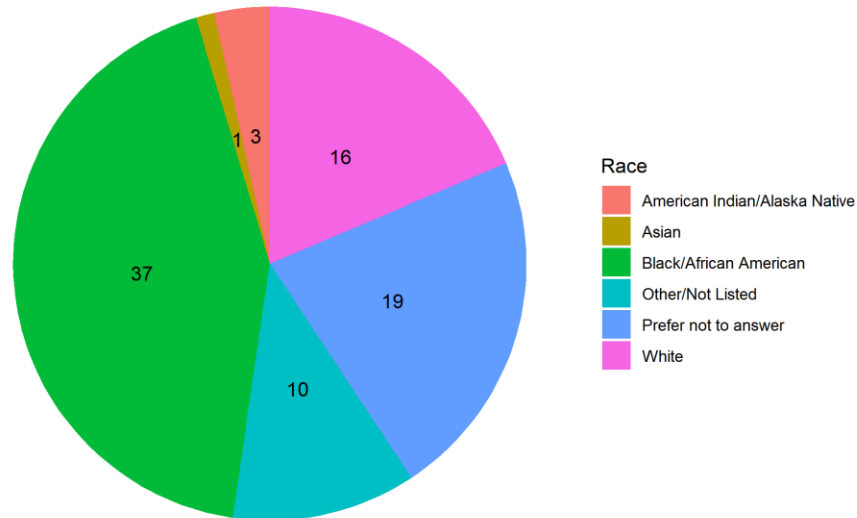
Complaint Data 2023

In the month of July 2023, CPOC referred 4 complaints to PPD's Internal Affairs Division (IAD). CPOC has referred a total of 86* complaints this calendar year to date. These charts show demographic data from 2023 complaints, as reported by complainants.

Gender Breakdown



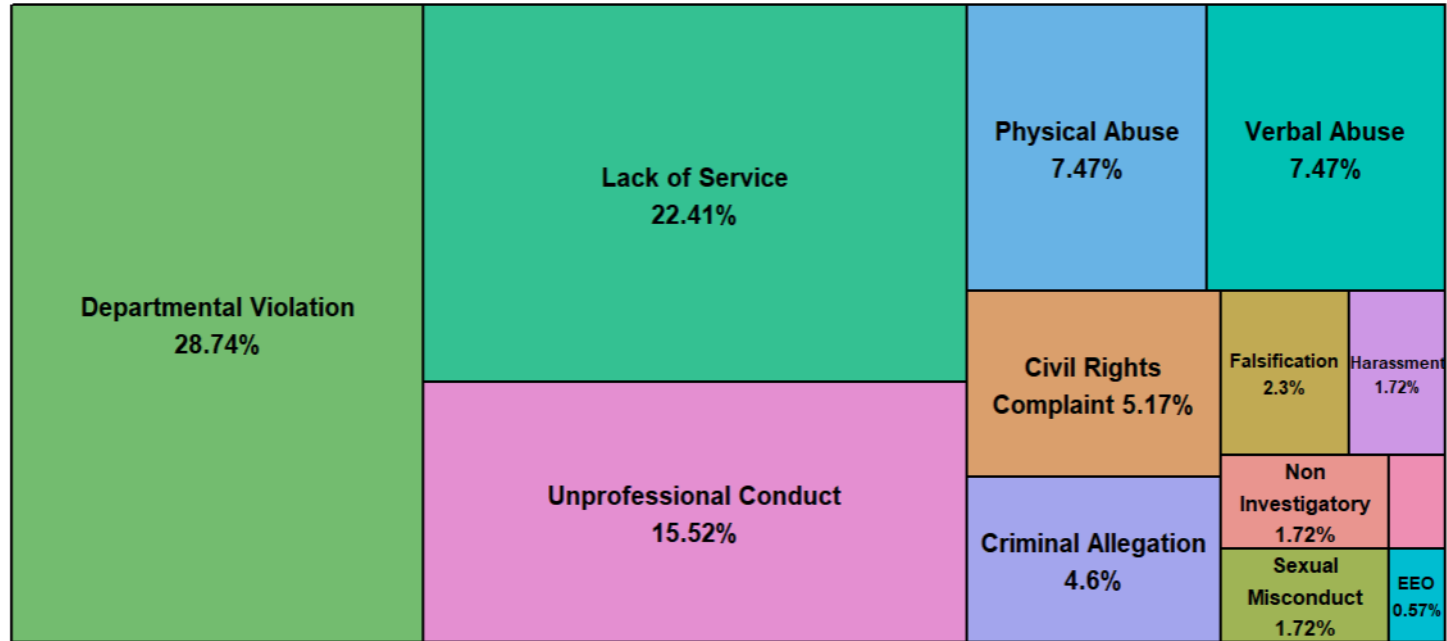
Race Breakdown

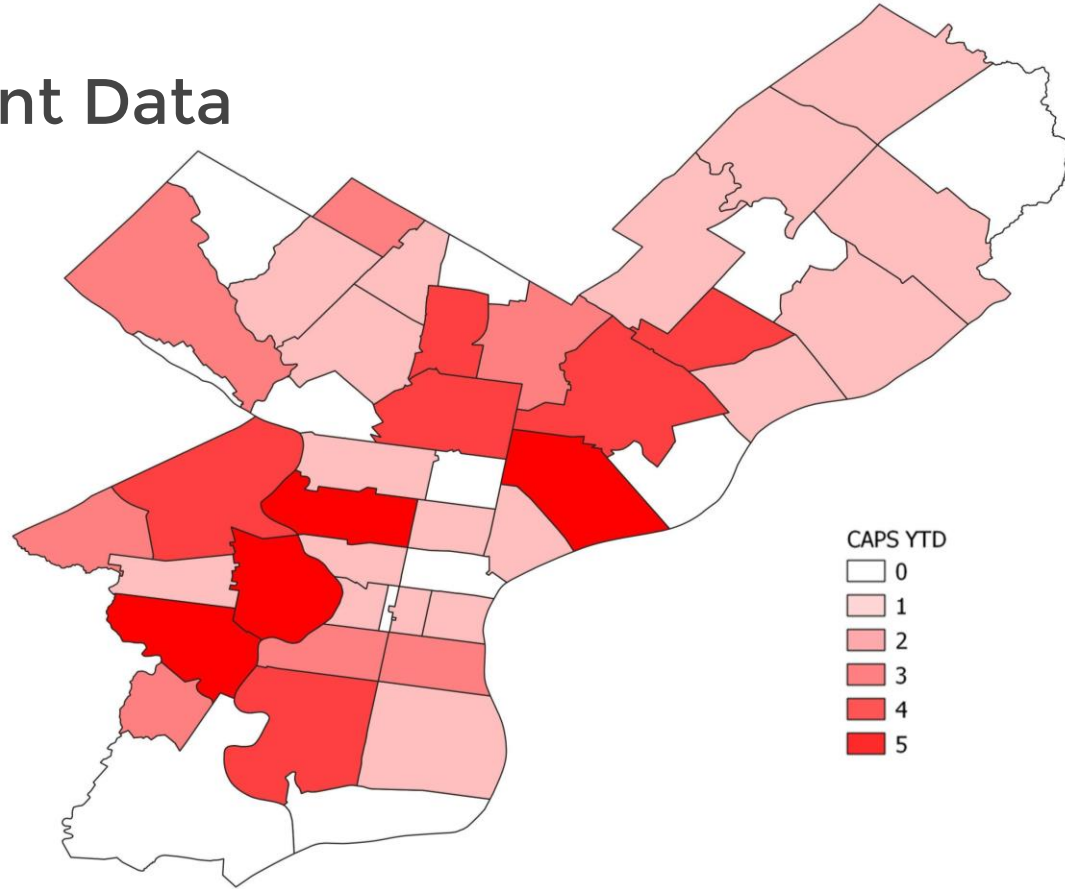
Complaint Data 2023: Allegations

Nearly 30% of the allegations in 2023 to date were Departmental Violations. A single complaint can have multiple misconduct allegations.

Auditing & Monitoring Unit

BWC compliance audit:

- Change from having to drive to Internal Affairs in the Northeast to view videos needed for the audit on DVDs to being able to go to PPD headquarters at 15th and Callowhill and watch the videos in Lt. Robbins's office.
 - Although CPOC previously had a lot of issues with getting the data and videos in a timely manner with some contacts at PPD, Lt. Robbins is an excellent partner who responds quickly to requests.
 - Lt. Robbins will soon be Captain Robbins, great to be building good working relationships with someone rising in the ranks at PPD.
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Auditing & Monitoring Unit

- CPOC is awaiting the Police Commissioner's finalized introduction letter on PBI Part 2 Report, which will complete the final draft. This will then be sent to CPOC Commissioners for review prior to publication.
- CPOC's Active Monitoring proposal is final stages and a draft has been shared with the CPOC Commissioners. We hope to formally send to the PPD within 2 weeks.





Investigation Unit

CPOC Director of Investigations and Director of Community Outreach and Relations, met with Command Staff from the 911 radio division. CPOC received a facility tour and talked with the 911 call taker and dispatcher staff. CPOC received information about the process of from when the 911 call is received up until PPD officers are dispatched. CPOC observed some 911 calls and the call intake process during a real-time demonstration.

CPOC plans to create a public explainer for the community of about the 911 intake process and to improve CPOC policy recommendations and investigations in the future.





Investigation Unit

PPD defines an officer-involved shooting as “the discharge of a firearm, whether accidental or intentional, by a police officer, whether on or off duty [at a person].”

There were 3 officer-involved shootings in February and March 2023, before CPOC’s Director of Investigations started oversight.

There have been 6 Officer Involved shootings since March 6, 2023.

In the following cases, PPD’s OISI (Officer Involved Shooting Incident Unit) recommended no criminal charges to District Attorney’s Office (DAO). Unless otherwise indicated, these cases still under consideration by the DAO.





Officer Involved Shootings since March 6, 2023

- **March 24, 2023:** 1500 block of East Johnson Street (14th District)
- **April 17, 2023:** 20th and Chew Streets (35th District) - *DAO has cleared the officers in this case*
- **April 29, 2023:** 400 block of W. Bringhurst Street (39th District)
- **May 4, 2023:** 2300 block of Fawn Street (22nd District)
- **May 31, 2023:** 2800 block of Ruth Street (24th District)
- **June 8, 2023:** 7600 block of Ridge Avenue (located in the 5th District, involving 14th District officer)


In each case, CPOC will continue to monitor PPD's administrative investigations and may issue opinions and/or policy recommendations, as needed.





Policy Unit


The Policy Director and Unit Staff continued to work on the following projects:

- **Policy Explainers Pending**
 - Accident and Vehicle Investigations
 - Rights of Trans and Non Binary Individuals
 - Gun Returns for Legally Owned Weapons
 - **Mediation Program**
 - Meeting with Temple University program evaluation
 - Temple University, Center for Conflict Management and Media Impact will begin conducting focus groups in the community regarding the mediation program
 - We are developing a brief video, infographics, and articles to publicize and explain the benefits of mediation
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Policy Unit

The Policy Unit is currently working on the following projects, which are in various stages of development:

- **Active Monitoring Proposal for the Audit Unit was finalized and sent to CPOC leadership for approval**
 - **Non-Emergency Reporting Proposal sent to CPOC leadership for approval**
 - **STOP Grant - Resolutionary Partners program with Temple University, Center for Conflict Management and Media Impact, Community Policing Curriculum in development. This program and partnership is funded by the DOJ/BJA Stop School Violence Program. The Outreach and Policy Unit are participating in this program.**
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Outreach & Training Unit

The Outreach & Unit consists of our *Director of Outreach & Constituent Services, Training and Outreach Manager* and a *Community Outreach & Constituent Services Specialist*. This Unit is tasked with handling incoming complaints, providing constituent services to city residents who need resources and connection with other City services, community education and training of staff, as well as engaging with the many diverse communities of our City.

We look forward to expanding our staff in order to make meaningful connections with underserved communities while advocating and promoting transparent and equitable policing.
