
## WHAT IS NALOXONE?

- Naloxone is a life-saving medication that temporarily reverses an opioid overdose.
- Naloxone is also known as Narcan.
- You can get naloxone at the pharmacy. You don't need a prescription.
- Naloxone is safe and has little to no side effects.
- There are different types of naloxone:



## WHAT ARE **OPIOIDS?**

- Opioids are drugs that are used to treat pain.
- Opioids can be prescribed by a doctor but can be bought and used illegally.

- Examples of opioids:
  - Heroin • Fentanyl
  - (Duragesic) • Oxycodone
  - (OxyContin, Percocet)
  - Hydrocodone (Vicodin, Lortab)
