What do Serve Philadelphia VISTAs do?

Healthy Futures: Access to Health Care

Project Goal:

The DBHIDS Immigrant/Refugee and Language Access Services Unit was established to develop system-wide, culturally, and linguistically appropriate programs, practices, and procedures for service delivery to meet the needs of immigrant and refugee communities with behavioral health and intellectual disability challenges. To ensure DBHIDS meets the needs of these diverse communities, the VISTA will collect and synthesize data, research, and stakeholders' input to inform the Language Access Service Plan, Immigrant and Refugee Wellness Academy (IRWA) and other initiatives.

Infant and Toddler Well-Being VISTA Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual disAbility Services, Infant Toddler Early Intervention

Education: School readiness and learning loss

Project Goal:

The Infant and Toddler Well-Being VISTA will work with the Philadelphia Infant Toddler Early Intervention (ITEI) team to increase and sustain referrals to ITEI from the Philadelphia Department of Human Services (DHS) and its affiliates, the Community Umbrella Agencies (CUA). The VISTA will address several complexities that impact the successful establishment and sustainment of referrals from DHS and the CUAs. As the County Children and Youth Agency, DHS is involved with approximately 1000 infants and toddlers annually who are in and out of home placements and are at special risk for developmental concerns due to early adversity. Research shows that social-emotional development is negatively affected at a higher rate for children in DHS placements. As DHS continues to adapt its policies and practices, ITEI aligns these improvements to be responsive to the needs of young children and their families.

Infant and Toddler Homelessness Resource VISTA Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual disAbility Services, Infant Toddler Early Intervention

Education: School readiness and learning loss

Project Goal:

Extreme poverty is the strongest predictor of homelessness and at least 11% of children living in poverty are homeless (American Psychological Association's Presidential Task Force, 2009). Unstable housing has a significant impact on early childhood development (Infants Exposed to Homelessness: Health, Health Care Use, And Health Spending from Birth to Age Six, 2019). Emergency and Transition Housing agencies have very limited resources to connect families to the Philadelphia Infant Toddler Early Intervention (ITEI). Direct, on-site support by ITEI yielded a significant increase in the number of referrals. The VISTA will work with the ITEI team to develop and evaluate effective procedures to promote referrals of families in Emergency and Transitional Housing and for families that are diverted from these housing options or are in other temporary housing options.

- Coordinate and attend on-site visits with a team member; speak directly with parents of infants and toddlers; answer their questions and support the referral to ITEI

Project Goal:

The Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual disAbility Services is launching the START Model, a community-based crisis intervention for individuals with intellectual disabilities, autism, and mental health needs. With this needed support, people with intellectual disabilities, autism and mental health needs have improved mental health, fewer restrictive hospital-based stays, and can more consistently and successfully live and work in their communities. The START VISTA will work with the team to identify and integrate the programmatic and data informed processes that achieve and sustain these outcomes.

The fastest growing group of foreign-born Philadelphians between 2000-2016 came from Africa. The City-wide African immigrant population is close to 25,000 and the majority live in underserved neighborhoods with an average rate of living below the Federal Poverty Line. The VISTA will work with the Commerce Department and community partners to engage with African and diaspora communities and neighborhoods, to identify their needs with regards to entrepreneurship development and connections to economic opportunities, and to ultimately create the foundation for the city to better design programs to support diaspora immigrant owned businesses.

Strategic Engagement VISTA Department of Labor, Office of Worker Protections

Economic Opportunity: Employment/Workforce Development

Project Goal:

The Strategic Engagement VISTA will build structural capacity for the Office of Worker Protections and will prioritize the Fair Workweek law, a labor law that protects fair scheduling and increases economic security for certain service retail and hospitality workers. Shortfalls in weekly work hours (under employment), low wages, wage and job protection, and lack of access to benefits fuel poverty. Sustainable outcomes include increased worker protection resources, strengthened partnerships, and increased presence of the Office on public platforms.

- Review news at the local, state, and national level to identify labor law violations and other agencies approaches and wins on worker protections
- Sit in on an interview with a complainant and an Office Investigator to gain insights into how workers advocate for themselves in the workplace

- Attend a training cohosted by the Office and a partner organization on how to file a complaint

Eviction Prevention and Housing VISTA

Department of Planning and Development, Division of Housing and Community Development

Economic Opportunity: Housing (esp. displacement due to COVID-19 and eviction prevention)

Project Goal:

The financial strain of the pandemic, combined with rising rental costs, has caused eviction filings to increase over the past few years while federal support for rental assistance is decreasing. Eviction impacts black and brown communities in disproportionate ways and the city is working to respond to this issue from several avenues. As the city transitions from direct response to the COVID-19 crisis and creates new and improved programs for constituent resources, departments can ensure that the racial disparity within the housing crisis is addressed.

The PHL City ID provides a secure and affordable photo identification card for anyone living in Philadelphia, age 13 and older. The card is especially beneficial for those who have a hard time obtaining other forms of identification because of cost or other barriers. The Engagement and Partnership Relations VISTA will develop an engagement and recruitment plan to identify opportunities to increase PHL City ID partnerships. Obtaining additional partnerships will increase PHL City IDs program appeal, inclusivity, and visibility throughout the City and specifically within the most vulnerable communities. This project will promote the PHL City ID as a low-barrier, low-cost, inclusive ID that all Philadelphians can obtain to access basic needs (housing, drug and alcohol treatment, employment, bank accounts, etc.).

Housing Insecurity and Poverty Policy VISTA Managing Director's Office for Health and Human Services

Project Goal:

The Managing Director's Office – Health and Human Services (MDO-HHS) has developed or supported implementation of two programs that prevent housing insecurity through policy. These programs serve low-income populations which may have experienced water insecurity or interaction with the criminal justice system. The VISTA will, in collaboration with the Department of Public Health, the Office of Community Empowerment and Opportunity, and the Office of Criminal Justice, play a key role in the continued implementation of services. The VISTA will also focus on development and documentation of a strong sustainability plan for each program.

The first will serve individuals on Medicaid by increasing their access to more services and support. The second will serve individuals with medical debt by reducing their payments towards their debt. The third will serve people who are incarcerated by providing access to behavioral health care. The VISTA will play a key role in implementing services in partnership with City stakeholders, launching initiatives and develop a sustainability plan.

Project Goal:

The Office of Domestic Violence Strategies (ODVS) provides leadership for an interagency collaboration called Shared Safety, which aims to improve Health and Human Services systems' responses to relational violence (domestic violence, sexual violence, and human trafficking). Relational violence disproportionately impacts low-income people of color. The VISTA will build capacity to strategically address systemic gaps and improve outcomes for people experiencing relational violence by working with staff to establish, implement, and evaluate a Shared Safety strategic plan.

Project Goal:

Philadelphia is launching a citywide network of Neighborhood Resource Centers (NRCs), replicating a successful national model that seeks to reduce recidivism and incarceration rates while also providing services to justice involved Philadelphians, their families, and community members. NRCs' goal is to reduce probation/parole violations by removing barriers and meeting people where they are and deliver critical services and programs in welcoming community centered spaces. NRCs are neighborhood based one stop centers that will unite community supervision, access to citywide resources and community-based providers to offer a broad range of services to support holistic reintegration, restoration, and wellness, while also building trust between city agencies and neighborhoods.

Project Goal:

The 25,000 Philadelphians returning annually from incarceration often experience the impacts of poverty and are faced with complex challenges navigating the process of community reintegration. People need access to comprehensive reentry supports – requiring a robust network of services. To create stronger reentry services, the Philadelphia Reentry Coalition (PRC) facilitates collaboration, leverages resources, and builds capacity among stakeholders. The VISTA will embed a strong communications strategy and online Member Portal into ongoing Coalition activities and operations to ensure the continued ability to provide capacity building resources to members to in turn strengthen reentry services.

Safe Routes Philly VISTA

Managing Director's Office, Office of Transportation, Infrastructure & Sustainability, Office of Complete Streets

Education: School readiness and learning loss

Project Goal:

The Safe Routes Philly VISTA will work at 4 schools to train and support a team of teachers and staff who then work to encourage students to use active transportation. These methods, such as a walking school bus program and a traffic safety curriculum, can increase attendance and academic performance, helping to reduce learning loss and improve academic readiness. At the end of the third year of the project, the 12 schools supported by the VISTA will be positioned to train and mentor schools in the program beyond close out of the project.

- Meet with school admin and teachers to pitch the walking school bus program and the Safe Routes Philly curriculum.

The Kensington and North Philadelphia areas are home to primarily Black and brown communities that face some of the highest rates of gun violence and unintentional drug overdose deaths in Philadelphia. The VISTA member will work to understand the complex dynamic within specific, highly segregated Philadelphia communities to organize an effective response between City agencies that addresses relevant intersections.

Environmental Stewardship: Awareness & Stewardship

Project Goal:

The Rebuild program is the City of Philadelphia's most historic investment into our parks, recreation centers and libraries, investing over \$500 million across these sites. The Rebuild Engagement VISTA will work with our team to address poverty by improving environmental stewardship where two thirds of Rebuild sites are located in areas with over 30% of the population living in poverty. The VISTA will work with the Rebuild team to develop a series of critical toolkits that will be used to support meaningful design feedback loops, coordination between city agencies serving the same neighborhoods and ensure resident contact is sustained, as a core poverty alleviation strategy is to build civic capacity and engagement.

- Meet with a design and construction project manager to outline key design decisions
- Meet with an architect and community engagement vendor to build a bank of survey questions
- Create a list of the key city departments working on infrastructure and capital related projects in Rebuild neighborhoods

Two VISTA members will focus on two evaluation and impact projects. The first project develops citywide recommendations for how to collect demographic data from residents. The second project helps departments create performance measures for their racial equity strategies. The VISTA will do research, project management, and project evaluations.

Research by Harvard Professor of Public Economics Raj Chetty, and others, has provided clear evidence that economic opportunity is spatially distributed, which means that residents from segregated, under resourced neighborhoods face significantly greater barriers to economic mobility. In Philadelphia, a child from Fairhill is projected to have an adult household income of \$19,000 (well below the federal poverty level for a household of 3) compared to \$52,000 for a child from Bustleton. The goal of the VISTA project is to identify and reduce barriers to economic mobility through collaboration, data analysis, and strategic interventions in targeted neighborhoods. The project will also inform the longer-term strategic direction of the Neighborhood Initiatives unit.

According to USDA 2022 data, Philadelphia has over 250,000 individuals who lack access to nutritious foods. 16 out of 100 households in Philadelphia are food insecure. The Office of Homeless Services procures and distributes food to 31 emergency shelters and 28 emergency meal sites in Philadelphia. The VISTA will be responsible for data collection and reporting to ensure culturally responsive, accessible food is available at the emergency shelters and meal sites across the city.
