MECHANICAL STREET CLEANING PROGRAM INFORMATION APRIL THROUGH NOVEMBER

The Mechanical Street Cleaning Program is part of the City of Philadelphia's commitment to reduce trash and litter conditions in the City's most vulnerable communities. Mechanical street cleaning is an effective tool in reducing litter from city streets and preventing trash and debris from entering the water systems.

Aligning with Mayor Parker's approach to addressing qualityof-life issues, the Sanitation Department continues to provide mechanical cleaning in 14 neighborhoods identified through the Litter Index as having the highest concentration of litter. These areas have been identified as requiring additional city services to supplement cleaning efforts in the area.

Effective April 1, 2024, the Mechanical Street Cleaning Program will launch in the following residential areas:

Frankford: Levick to Adams from Griscom St to Keystone

Germantown: Berkley to Chelten from Pulaski to Wakefield

Kensington: 2nd to Kensington from Tioga to Lehigh Ave.

Logan: Godfrey to Roosevelt Blvd from Broad to Mascher

Nicetown: Broad to Hunting Park Av, Clarissa St, Stenton Av from Lindley/Logan Sts to Allegheny Av

North Central: Broad to 22nd from Diamond to Allegheny

Paschall: 58th to 70th from Cobbs Creek to Dicks Av

Point Breeze: Christian to McKean from Broad to 24th Sts.

Port Richmond: Kensington to Aramingo from Tioga to Lehigh

South Philly: McKean to Oregon from 4th to 8th

Southwest: Woodland to Kingsessing from 49th to Cemetery Ave. and 58th to 61st from Cobbs Creek to Kingsessing

Strawberry Mansion: Diamond/Sedgley to Allegheny from 22nd to 33rd Sts

West Fairhill: Front St to 13th from Glenwood to Diamond

West Philly: Parkside to Spring Garden from 52nd to 40th

The program runs through November 1st to coincide with warmer-weathered months and decrease the potential for snow and ice.

Some streets in each area will have sidewalk cleaning maintenance along with mechanical broom cleaning weekly.

To facilitate a more detailed cleaning, residents on select streets will be required to move their vehicles. Residents on those streets may notice no parking signs installed and are required to adhere to the posted timeframes beginning the week of April 29 to avoid enforcement measures. Mechanical Street Cleaning in Philadelphia operates annually on select routes. Residents should follow posted "no parking" signs to allow the mechanical broom to clean the roadways from curb to curb at the scheduled time.

Authorized Philadelphia ticketing agencies will issue warnings on vehicles parked on the roadway during specified no parking times during the first month of the program. **On or after April 29, posted "no parking" signs will be enforced with assessed fines.**

Mechanical sweeping will take place Monday through Thursday, except holidays, between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. No service will be performed on City-observed holidays. Crews will resume cleaning the following week.

Cleaning times on streets are staggered and/or occur on alternate days to minimize inconvenience to residents. Alternate street parking intervals occur between the hours of 9 a.m. to 11 a.m.; 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.

The following is the sequence of the mechanical cleaning pilot in each area:

- Streets Department laborers equipped with back pack blowers and hand brooms will clean some pilot routes.
- Mechanical brooms will follow cleaning crews once debris is blown off sidewalks and curb lines.
- To ensure cleaning is maintained, SWEEP Officers will patrol neighborhoods to address Sanitation code violations related to litter and dumping.

The Mechanical Street Cleaning Pilot Program is a partnership between the Streets Department and the residents of Philadelphia:

The City will provide resources to:

- Mechanically Clean Streets Weekly
- · Remove litter and debris from sidewalks
- Collect illegally dumped material

Residents in the pilot area are asked to:

- Follow posted "no parking" signs
- Place trash and recycling collections out on designated day at authorized location between 7p.m. the day before and 7a.m. on trash day
- Place trash and recycling collections out in proper containers / bags to prevent spillage
- Only set household trash for pick up.
- Sweep sidewalks and gather debris. Do not sweep into the street
