

On 8 March 2024, the Philadelphia Historical Commission reviewed your application for 1805-09 WALNUT ST and its Architectural Committee's report and recommendation of 20 February 2024. At that time, the Historical Commission voted to approve the revised application, with the staff to review details, pursuant to Standard 9 and the Storefront Guideline.

To complete the processing of your application, please submit an application reflecting the proposal approved by the Historical Commission to the Department of Licenses & Inspections using eCLIPSE, the Department's electronic commercial licensing, inspection, and permit service enterprise, which can be found online at this link: https://eclipse.phila.gov/phillylmsprod/pub/lms/Login.aspx

You have the right to appeal the Historical Commission's decision, pursuant to Section 14-1008 of the Philadelphia Code, which reads:

Appeals. Any person aggrieved by the issuance or denial of any permit reviewed by the Commission may appeal such action to the Board of License and Inspection Review. Such appeal must be filed within 30 days of the date of receipt of notification of the Commission's action. The Board of License and Inspection Review shall give written notice of any such appeal to the Commission within three days of the filing of the appeal.
