Position Summary

This Recreation Specialty Instructor (RSI) will help run youth summer sports activities, including camps, clinics, and pop-up programs. Coaches will lead children in recreational sports and physical activities at locations around the city. The goal is for every child to have fun, make friends, and develop new skills to help them thrive

Coaches should be enthusiastic about sports and working with young people. They should be able to effectively communicate with key stakeholders including children, parents, other coaches, and Parks & Rec staff. They should be energetic on the field and dedicated to supporting social and emotional growth in their players.

Coaches should have a general background in sports, with advanced experience in soccer, basketball, or baseball/softball preferred. Coaches do not need to have coached before, but must be enthusiastic about working with young people in sport.

Responsibilities

- Coach young people in sport, emphasizing fun and inclusive play
- Lead demonstrations, drills, games, and other activities
- Ensure a safe environment where everyone can play and have fun
- Manage the flow of activities to ensure participation of all youth
- Assist with camp logistics around arrival, setup, breakdown, and departure
- Be aware of campers' unique needs and how to best instruct each individual child
- Where appropriate, manage less experienced coaches and design program plans
- Other duties as assigned

Requirements & Qualifications

- Must be skilled and interested in working with children
- Completion of forms for PA State Police Criminal background, PA Department of Public Welfare Childline and FBI clearance. Do not send in for clearances. Must submit through the Parks & Recreation Department
- Successful candidates must be a city of Philadelphia resident as a condition of employment.
- Must be able to lift at least 50 pounds of weight
- Must be able to spend long periods of time standing
- Must be able to walk/move for extended periods of time
- Must have experience with and interest in sports and coaching young people
