




Previous Engagement:

OTIS hosted two community meetings during the summer and early fall of 2023, and also participated in a neighborhood street fair later in the fall to engage with the community for this project. Neighbors showed interest in safety improvements like raised crosswalks, speed cushions, and new crossings, as shown on the map on the first page.

About Great Streets PHL

Timeline:

- Collaborative Planning & Design with community members: Spring 2023 - Summer 2024
- Preliminary Engineering: Summer 2024 2025
- Final Design & Engineering: Fall 2025 2026
- Construction: Anticipated 2027-2028

Great Streets PHL seeks support for needed transportation safety improvements and roadway infrastructure upgrades along seven important corridors in Philadelphia.

IMPROVE SAFETY: This street is one of several on the Vision Zero High Injury Network (the streets with a high concentration of traffic crashes that resulted in serious injuries or where lives were lost). Improvements to the street, design will reduce traffic crashes, deaths, and injuries.

REPAIR & REFRESH STREETS: Bring the street into to a "state of good repair" - new paving and best practice safety improvements will be made.

COLLABORATE: Collaborate with community members and residents to get input on the type of improvements that are wanted and needed, and where those improvements should go.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT: Create connections to job training and resources that will enable local workers to benefit from job opportunities associated with project construction.
