First Fix Playground Scope

- New Playground
- Pedestrian walkway from Wayne Ave
- Breezeway between 1911 Rec
 Center and Basketball Gym









New Playground: Demolish existing playground replace with new inclusive playground equipment, safety surface, cameras and lighting.

Scope of Improvements for Happy Hollow Playground PPR Standard Furnishings to be added









Accessibility Improvements: Improve breezeway and associated drainage between 1911 Rec Center and Basketball Gym

Replace both breezeway doors for accessibility







Historic 1911 Recreation Center Scope

- Roof & Masonry throughout building
- Interior Doors & Thresholds
- Bathrooms Accessibility & Finishes
- HVAC throughout building
- Electrical throughout building
- Lighting upgrades
- WiFi Infrastructure Upgrades
- Abatement throughout building
- Ceilings Repair


