What is a neighborhood bikeway?

- A street with **low traffic volumes and speeds** that is comfortable for people walking and biking
- A key part of a **low-stress** network of bicycle routes that increases road **safety for all users**
- Traffic calming treatments, signs, and pavement markings increase awareness that the road is a bicycle priority route. The **top three treatments identified by Strawberry Mansion residents** as priorities are on the right.

- Summer 2023** ● Public workshop, draft route map developed
- Fall 2023** ● Online survey, feedback on route map and treatments
- WE ARE HERE Spring 2024** ● Updated route map, online survey, feedback on route map and priorities
- Summer 2024** ● Final design for priority routes, ongoing outreach, apply for construction funding

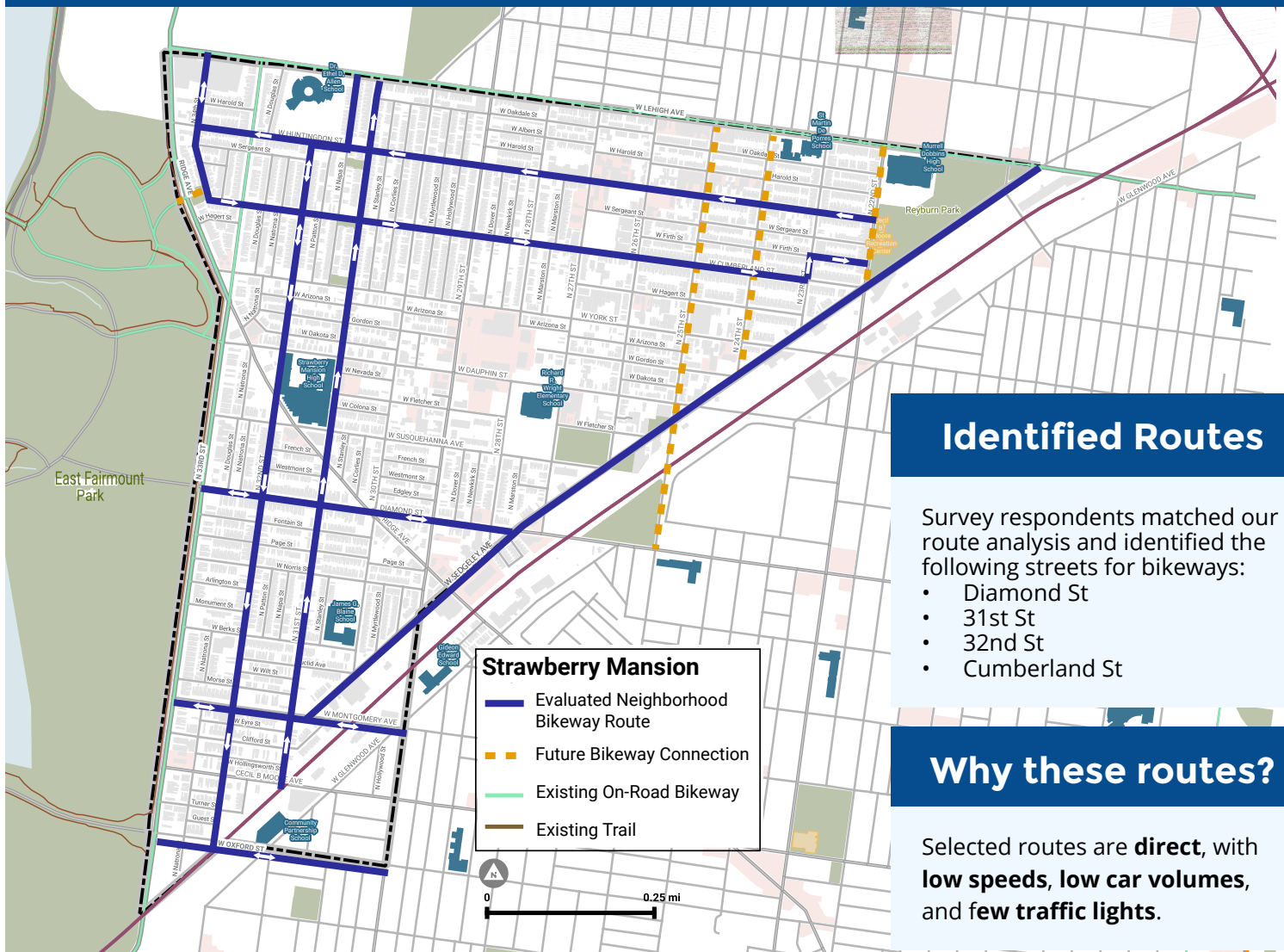

Identified Routes

Survey respondents matched our route analysis and identified the following streets for bikeways:

- Diamond St
- 31st St
- 32nd St
- Cumberland St

Why these routes?

Selected routes are **direct**, with **low speeds, low car volumes, and few traffic lights**.

Next Steps

- Look out for pop-up events at schools and recreation centers to learn more!
- OTIS will finalize the route map and treatment preferences based on feedback.
- There will be ongoing engagement as the routes move forward towards design and construction
- OTIS will be able to apply for grant funding to implement these plans.
