BACKGROUND:

This application proposes demolishing a non-historic garage and constructing a three-story residential building at the open rear area of 2313 Green Street. The new construction would face Wallace Street and would not connect to the historic building. In December 2023, the new building was proposed as 5,194 square feet with 5 residential units. The cladding material was a mix of red brick and gray metal standing-seam siding. The most visible area of the building would be the north and west elevations with the north elevation visible from a driveway entry along Wallace Street.

Although the Architectural Committee recommended approval at its 5 December 2023 meeting, neighbors and local community groups communicated their concerns about the project at the Historical Commission meeting of 12 January 2024. The Commission voted to table the application to allow time for the applicant to engage with concerned community members. Between January and June 2024, the applicant worked to incorporate community feedback and revised the proposal, which has been submitted for final review.

The revised proposal is a three-story building with a significantly reduced footprint and massing. The building is now proposed as 2,629 square feet with three residential units. It is limited to the footprint of the existing non-historic garage and preserves the open space of the property's rear yard. The first two floors of the exterior are proposed as red brick, and the third floor is proposed as slate or similar material.

SCOPE OF WORK:

- Demolish a non-historic two-story garage.
- Construct a three-story building.

STANDARDS FOR REVIEW:

The Secretary of the Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties and Guidelines include:

- Standard 9: New additions, exterior alterations, or related new construction shall not
 destroy historic materials, features, and spatial relationships that characterize the
 property. The new work shall be differentiated from the old and shall be compatible with
 the historic materials, features, size, scale, and proportion to protect the historic integrity
 of the property and its environment.
- Standard 10: New additions and adjacent or related new construction will be undertaken in such a manner that, if removed in the future, the essential form and integrity of the historic property and its environment will be unimpaired.

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: The Architectural Committee voted to recommend approval, provided additional brick is added to the west elevation, with the staff to review details, pursuant to Standards 9 and 10

REVISIONS IN RESPONSE TO ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE FEEDBACK

- Adjusted window sizes and divisions
- Adjusted massing to eliminate blank wall at eastern property line

REVISIONS IN RESPONSE TO COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PROCESS WITH NEAR NEIGHBORS AND NEIGHBORHOOD ORGANIZATION

- Community engagement included direct dialog by way of both a series of Zoom meetings and email correspondence with Spring Garden Civic Association (on behalf of a group of adjacent neighbors) and legal counsel representing the owners of 2315 Green Street
- The community engagement process resulted in the following revisions to the project:
 - Provided 3-story and 2-story alternate versions of the project for neighbors to choose
 - Neighbors opted for 3-story option with smaller footprint, which scaled back the mass of the building by almost 50%
 - Original Proposal SF: 5,194 SF with five units (3 x 1BR/ 1BA and 2 x 2BR/ 2BA)
 - Revised SF: 2,629 SF with three units (3 x 1BR/ 1BA)
 - Proposed (revised) building footprint limited to existing carriage house footprint
 - · Preservation of open courtyard is maintained alongside 2315 Green Street rear yard
 - Incorporated slate (or similar) façade cladding at 3rd story per neighbor request
 - · Eliminated roof decks and balconies
 - Incorporated 3'-0" setback on third story from 2315 Green Street property line and 2'-0" setback on the north side and 1'-6" setback from the south
 - Excavation to be limited to support slab on grade construction, no basement space
 - Introduced additional façade articulation and alignment to adjacent historic carriage house
 - · Communication is ongoing related to the specifics of excavation and construction logistics

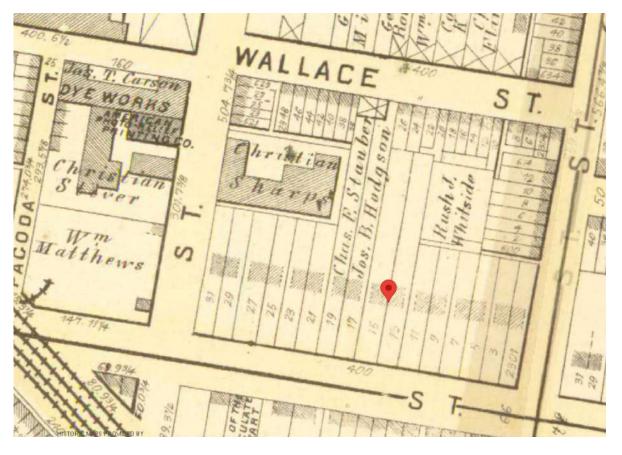

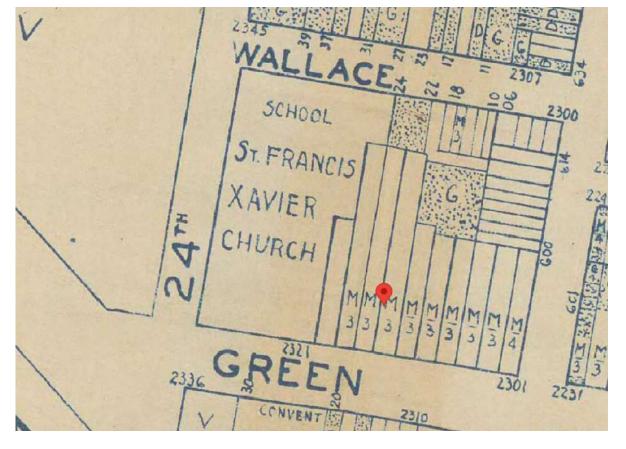
