TO: Owners and operators of air pollution sources within Philadelphia FROM: Edward Braun, Air Management Services Program Manager

RE: Notice Regarding Air Management Services: Public Records Access and

Disclosure Policies

Pursuant to the Pennsylvania Right to Know (RTK) Law, 67 P.S. § 67.101 <u>et. seq.</u>, the City of Philadelphia Department of Public Health, Air Management Services (AMS) is generally required to provide access to public records in its possession upon request. <u>See e.g.</u> 65 P.S. § 65.302. **Documents subject to public disclosure include, but are not limited to, air pollution permit / plan approval applications, air pollution permits / licenses, facility emission reports, Notices of Violation, Administrative Orders, and settlement agreements.**

Documents or information submitted to AMS, other than emissions data, that would reveal trade secrets, methods of production / manufacture, or other secret processes if made public are exempt from disclosure. See 35 P.S. § 4013.2; 65 P.S. § 67.708(b)(11); Philadelphia Air Management Regulation (AMR) I. § II.B.3., C. Any party seeking to take advantage of these protections for documents submitted to AMS must:

- 1. Mark selected documents submitted to AMS, in whole or in part, as being "Confidential."
- 2. Provide AMS with written explanations as to why the so marked documents are entitled to protection as provided for by law. See Id.
