The brief description of the project as stated below and the enclosed drawings show the intended extent of work.











EXISTING CONDITIONS AND DEMOLITION PLAN

Art Commission Response to questions for Administrative Approval

- 1. Lighting details: existing and any new proposed
 - a. There are exisiting lights to remain, and no new lights proposed. Existing lights have been added to the existing site plan in the presentation.
- 2. Tree Details: Confirmation that one diseased tree is the only tree to be removed; photo of diseased tree, and total number and species of new tree plantings
 - a. There is only one tree that is to be removed, shown below. As you can see from the photo, taken in Spetember of 2024, this tree displays signs of early leaf drop indicative of disease, compared to the full canopies of the other trees on the site. We are proposing 5 new trees, with 4 Red Maples (Acer rubrum) and 1 Serviceberry (Amalanchier canadensis).

- 3. Stormwater/drainage details
 - a. We are proposing a new underground stone basin for the lower playground area.
- 4. Fencing
 - a. Approximately 267 linear feet of 4' high chainlink fence is to be removed, and is now reflected on the exisiting conditions and demolition plan in the presentation.
 Previously, this fencing was utilized to encompass play areas & separate uses. Due to the implementation of planting beds in these same areas, fencing is no longer

necessary, and improved viewsheds and circulation are the end result.

5. Pedestrian circulation

a. Additional entrances to the project area have been added to the Site Context presentation sheet. There is an exisitng-to-remain point of entry from McMahon street. Rec Center building access points are also shown.
